

Data Protection Act 1998:

otherwise), applications for any of the foregoing, copyright, database rights, domain names, plant variety rights, Know-How, trade or business names, moral rights and other similar rights or obligations whether registrable or not in any country (including but not limited to the United

Kingdom) and the right to sue for passing off;

"Maintenance Fees" Means any maintenance fees payable to the Student(s) in

accordance with the Studentship;

"Principal Funder" Means APHA whose terms and conditions are annexed to

Schedule 1;

"Project" means the project described in Schedule 1;

"Project Outputs" means the outputs produced in the Project as described in

Schedule 1;

"Student" Means the student nominated by the University for

participation in the Project and accepted by APHA, as

referred to in Schedule 1.

"Studentship" Means the studentship undertaken by the Student in

respect of the Project covered by this Agreement;

"Term"

means the term of this Agreement, beginning on the Commencement Date and ending on the Expiry Date unless otherwise terminated or extended in accordance with the terms of this Agreement in accordance with Clause 8.

- 1.2 Words imparting the singular number shall include the plural and vice versa, words imparting the masculine shall include the feminine and neuter and vice versa, and words imparting persons shall include corporate bodies, unincorporated associations and partnerships.
- 1.3 Headings to Clauses and paragraphs are for ease of reference only and shall not affect the interpretation or construction of this Agreement.
- 1.4 References in this Agreement to any statute or statutory provision include reference to the same as amended, modified, re-enacted or replaced from time to time, whether before or after the date of this Agreement.


2 Project scope




3 Responsibilities of the parties


3.1 The Parties agree to use reasonable endeavours to perform their obligations under this Agreement and carry out the Project diligently in accordance with Schedule 1.
















14 Bribery and corruption

17 Variation


17.1 All variations or modifications to this Agreement will only be binding if recorded in writing and signed by the Authorised Officers of the Parties.

20 Sustainability


