Expression of interest to support non-traditional care providers to become DSPT compliant

Background

Better Security, Better Care is a national programme to improve data and cyber security in the adult social care provider sector. It is led by a programme board whose members include NHSX, NHS Digital, NHS England and Improvement, the Local Government Association, the Association of Directors of Adult Social Services and, on behalf of the care provider sector, [Digital Social Care](#). You can find more about the programme [here](#).

The BSBC programme supports the sector with resources and assistance to help care providers complete the Data Security & Protection Toolkit (DSPT). The DSPT is a free, online self-assessment for health and care providers to evaluate and improve their data and cyber security. It's an ambitious programme with the aim that all CQC registered adult social care services will have completed the DSPT to 'standards met'. The programme is delivered by a diverse group of care sector organisations, including many local care associations, with colleagues from the NHS, ADASS and local councils also involved.

Better Security, Better Care is led by a programme board whose members are NHSX, NHS Digital, NHS England and Improvement, the Local Government Association, the Association of Directors of Adult Social Services and, Digital Social Care on behalf of care providers.

Reflecting the increased importance of the secure sharing of information between health and care services, the programme wishes to explore and support non-traditional care providers to become DSPT compliant.

The project

We are providing grant funding for a discrete piece of work to explore and better understand how to support non-traditional care providers to become DSPT compliant.

The current model of support being used by the Better Security, Better Care programme is based widely on supporting traditional care providers including

residential care homes, nursing homes and domiciliary care. The ambition of the programme is to achieve 100% compliance across the sector which means we need to better understand the unique needs of non-traditional care providers.

We need to understand and plan improved engagement through trade bodies who represent non-traditional care providers such as Shared Lives, mental health, hospices and supported living as well as organisations representing people drawing on social care.

Anticipated outcomes:

1. Establish the size and nature of these segments of the care sector.
2. Identify the unique challenges they face in becoming DSPT compliant and determine how best to engage with them.
3. Identify which topics need to be addressed to support this sector to comply with the DSPT publication requirements.
4. Create dedicated messaging campaigns and where required, guidance, for these segments of the care sector.
5. Develop and mobilise a programme of targeted support for these care providers.
