The Contractor is to prepare, for the Client's acceptance, the Construction Phase Plan (CPP) and the Environmental Management Plan (EMP) prior to starting the works

Working times

The *Contractor* will be permitted to work between 7.30am and 6.00pm on weekdays (Monday to Friday) However, certain sites may have specific access times and dates. These will be confirmed with the contractor before works commence and specified with in the attached Site Schedule 23 24.

Work times different to those specified above will be requested by the contractor via email correspondence and will be accepted by the EA Project Manager ahead of works starting.
