Task Title: RNAS Yeovilton - Conduct site wide risk assessments to meet the legal requirements of the Dangerous Substances Explosive Atmosphere Regulations 2002.

Brief Description of Task:

To conduct site wide risk assessments to meet the legal requirement as laid out in the Dangerous Substances Explosive Atmosphere Regulations 2002 at RNAS Yeovilton.

(or see attached detailed Statement of Requirement)

Background/Justification:

To conduct site wide risk assessments to meet the legal requirements of the Dangerous Substances Explosive Atmosphere Regulations 2002. RNAS Yeovilton is not compliant with the above statutory and mandated regulations as required by legislation. The site was subject to a Fuel Gas Safety Regulator inspection visit during September 15, the outcome of which is an improvement notice to comply in totality by September 2016. A pre-screening exercise carried out by the on-site SHE team looked at 800 buildings and revealed that as many as 200 may have dangerous substances in use. Due to the lack of a dedicated and suitably trained resource at the station, the notice period now imposed and the priority PUS has given to non-compliance across the MOD estate, this cannot be completed without outside resource. This measure will be funded £113k (incl. VAT) in 2016-17.

#### Activities to be Undertaken:

## Rest of the Facilities (second stage)

- Detailed review of the work done to date in the Pre-Screening table to be carried out.
- Visit to site to start the assessment process for all facilities which have DSEAR related activities and require HAC to be done. Anticipated 3 day visit with initial brief to all 9 departments on EPD process and setting out expectations required from station staff.
- Visit to individual facility areas as identified in pre-screening table to gather necessary information to start hazardous area assessments
- Develop deliverables for each facility visited including any update of pre-screening,,
   HAC table, HAC drawings as well as listing actions that arise from site visit.
- Second 3 day visit to continue process of visiting facilities
- Continue to develop deliverables for facilities visited
- Third site visit to finish process of visiting facilities
- Fourth 1 day visit to allow for final wrap up of process and to confirm station staff clear on any remaining actions needed to completed EPD process.
- Following last visit the final version of all deliverables to be issued.

Activities are to comply with JSP375 Chapter 9 – Seven Step approach

- 1 Site wide pre-screening
- 2 MF 5010 (existing risk assessments)
- 3 MF 5014 Stage 1 (filled in by facility where DSEAR applies)

- 5 HAC drawings showing the zone in both plan and section and the location they appear on the site.

- HAC carried out for the idenfified phase 2 areas, with accompanying HAC tables provided within the EPD.
