

Ashford Weir Photographic Record

Ashford Weir lies on the River Fowey (SX 20393 66495), approximately 5 km north-west of Liskeard. The weir is constructed from pointed slate with a total width (from left to right banks) of 29.5 m. A 1.4 m wide and 0.3 m deep notch has been cut into the weir crest 2.5 m from the left-hand side of the weir with a 2.9 m long slope extending downstream from this notch.

On the upstream right-hand bank there is an entrance to a mill leat, which historically fed Ashford Mill. Neither the mill nor weir are historically listed structures. This is relatively overgrown with vegetation and heavily silted with little to no flow passing through it.

The proposed fish passage easement works include a pre-barrage constructed across the channel downstream of the existing notch to reduce/ split the head difference and enable fish to migrate upstream even under lower flow conditions.
