


Results of Public consultation regarding the parks in Cam – Woodfields School 22nd March


A bad play space...

- wifi






Activity types most preferred:




- Aerobic (interactive sutu, memo, gym, hiking)

- Urban (ball games, wheeled sports, calisthenics)


Sensory play types most preferred:
