CLARIFICATION QUESTIONS AND RESPONSES

The National Archives has received a number of questions in relation to the above opportunity. Those questions, and their associated responses, are detailed below.

**Q1:** *Is the £10k budget an annual budget or a budget for the 3 years?*

**A1:** The figure of £10,000 is for the full 3 year term of the contract.

**Q2:** *Could you please confirm there is no need for data migration?*

**A2:** There is no need for data migration.

**Q3:** *Will there be possible extensions after the 3-year period, and if so do you need pricing for those extension years?*

**A3:** TNA has secured external funding for this contract, and any possible extension would probably be dependent on securing further funding, so no pricing is needed beyond the 3 years.

**Q4:** *Are you able to provide us with a copy of the phase 2 application form?*

**A5:** This has been provided as a separate document, and can be downloaded from Contracts Finder.

**Q5:** *We noticed on your website the following deadlines: 24 September 2018: Phase 1 applications open and 30 November 2018: Phase 1 application deadline. Will those applications still be dealt with your current system?*

**A5:** Yes.

**Q6:** *In relation to pricing, you mention number of users and user licenses. We think the number of applications per year is a better measure. Is it ok to provide a pricing based on that?*

**A6:** At the time of writing the ITT, we recognised that some systems may work on a 'per licence' basis where others may not. Provided the system is available to the user/application numbers indicated in the ITT, the contract price can be broken down and calculated according to the system you are proposing.

**Q7:** *Our data centre is ISO 27001 accredited and our system is independently penetration tested. Would you consider this to be sufficient as I note ISO 27001 certification is listed as a pass/fail item?*

**A7:** Your solution as detailed would pass this requirement.

**Q8:** *We don't have ISO27001 ourselves but we do have a Cyber Essentials Plus certification. Does that meet your requirement?*

**A8:** ISO 27001 itself isn't essential, so long as a supplier can evidence a good security approach through independent certification to another security standard. Cyber Essentials Plus would fulfil this (as opposed to Cyber Essentials without the Plus), as it is independently audited.
