Prospective bidders should note that no material changes to the Non Disclosure agreement will be considered.

All communication with the Authority must be conducted via the Procurement Portal: Jaggaer.

Where a supplier is unsure or requires any clarification, they should check with the contracting authority by the date set out in the notice.

PLEASE NOTE THE QUESTIONS ARE NUMBERED SEQUENTIALLY, HOWEVER SOME QUESTIONS HAVE NOT BEEN USED FOR THIS COMPETITION AND THAT IS WHY SOME SEQUENTIAL NUMBERS DO NOT APPEAR.

Overview of Requirements

Summary:

The UK Space Agency (UKSA) is seeking a supplier who can provide physical penetration testing in order to assess the security posture of a number of companies through simulated adversarial attacks. This will strengthen the UK Space Agency's work in this area by directly contributing activities to ensure UK space companies are able to grow with security in mind and space services and capabilities are more resilient to the risk of disruption.

Background:

The UK Space Agency exists to boost prosperity, understand the Universe, and protect our planet and outer space. We support a thriving UK space ecosystem – a network of investors, scientists, engineers, universities and research labs – and a sector that generates an annual income of £18.9 billion and employs 52,000 people across the country. Our staff includes scientists, engineers, commercial experts, project managers and policy officials who:

- catalyse investment to advance space-based technology and maximise UK space sector growth;
- deliver missions and capabilities that responsibly meet national needs and advance our understanding of the Universe; and
- champion the power of space to inspire people, offer greener, smarter solutions and support a sustainable future.

We are an executive agency of the Department for Science, Innovation and Technology (DSIT).

The Space, Security & Resilience Team promote a safe, sustainable and more secure space environment through international engagement and the development of national policy, plans and procedures to enable the delivery of space-based services and capabilities that are resilient to disruptive challenge. The UK Space Agency cyber security aims are to:

- Future proof by building a more resilient space community.
- Proactively demonstrate the secure intentions within the UK sector in order support international collaboration and investment.

Scope of the Opportunity:

UKSA is seeking a supplier to provide physical penetration testing for companies working in the space industry.

The full specification will be disclosed to shortlisted suppliers upon signature of a Non-Disclosure Agreement. Given the nature of the requirement and the national security considerations, no information will be disclosed to shortlisted bidders without a fully executed Non-Disclosure Agreement in place. Any shortlisted bidder who does not submit a Non-Disclosure Agreement will not be eligible to receive further documentation or participate in subsequent stages following shortlisting.

This requirement seeks suppliers who can:

 Support companies with understanding their existing security and resilience to physical attack.

- Inform corrections and upgrades to physical security by identifying vulnerabilities and providing recommendations for improvement.
- There is a likely to be the requirement to work with multiple (up to 4) companies at the same time in order to complete work packages within the timescale of the contract.

Operational requirements will be provided to shortlisted suppliers following NDA signature in the form of a Request for Proposals (RFP) document. Interested suppliers should note that owing to the national security implications of this requirement, bidders must be UK-registered companies where all strategic decisions are undertaken in the UK.

Funding & Duration:

- The maximum contract value is up to £240,000 (including VAT). 5 months + 1-year optional extension to be granted at the Contracting Authority's discretion, subject to budget availability. Up to £120,000 (including VAT) for initial 5 months and £120,000 (including VAT) for subsequent extension period.
- This is a call off value and not necessarily the full value of the contract as payment will only be made on completion of deliverables.
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- Duration: contract will end 31st March 2026, with option to extend to 31st March 2027.

Eligibility:

Responses are invited from UK-registered companies with proven capabilities in physical penetration testing (also known as "black teaming" or "red teaming") who meet the following requirements:

- Public sector experience of delivering sensitive projects.
- The ability to field personnel with Security Check (SC) clearance by the time of contract award.
- Cyber Essentials accredited, with robust processes for handling and storing classified or sensitive information (noting there is no requirement to handle information above OFFICIAL-SENSITIVE within this contract)
- CREST accreditation for physical penetration or QNUK Level 4 award in Physical Penetration Testing Operations (RQF)
