Information on Mandatory Declarations

1 IPR RESTRICTIONS

- 1.1 You must complete and attach DEFFORM 711 (Notification of Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Restrictions) as part of your Tender. You must provide details of any information / technical data that is deliverable or delivered under the Contract where it is, or may be, subject to any IPR restrictions (or any other type of restriction which may include export restrictions) affecting the Authority's ability to use or disclose the Information / technical data in accordance with the conditions of any resulting Contract. You must also identify any Contractor Deliverables subject to IPR which have been funded exclusively or in part by private venture, foreign investment or otherwise than by the Authority.
- 1.2 In particular, you must identify:
 - 1.2.1 any restriction on the provision of information to the Authority; any restriction on disclosure or the use of information by, or on behalf of, the Authority; any obligations to make payments in respect of IPR, and any Patent or Registered Design (or application for either) or other IPR (including unregistered Design Right) owned or controlled by you or a Third Party;
 - 1.2.2 any allegation made against you, whether by claim or otherwise, of an infringement of Intellectual Property Rights (whether a Patent, Registered Design, unregistered Design Right, Copyright or otherwise) or of a breach of confidence, which relates to the performance of any resultant Contract or subsequent use by or for the Authority of any Contractor Deliverables;
 - 1.2.3 the nature of any allegation referred to under sub-paragraph 1.2.2, including any obligation to make payments in respect of the Intellectual Property Right of any confidential information; and / or
 - 1.2.4 any action you need to take, or the Authority is required to take to deal with the consequences of any allegation referred to under sub-paragraph 1.2.2.
- 1.3 You must provide the Authority with details of every restriction and obligation referred to in paragraphs 1.1 and 1.2. The Authority will not acknowledge any such restriction unless so notified using DEFFORM 711 or as otherwise agreed under any resultant Contract. You must also provide, on request, any information required for authorisation to be given under Section 2 of the Defence Contracts Act 1958.
- 1.4 You should refer to the DEFFORM 711 Explanatory Notes for further information on how to complete the form.

2 NOTIFICATION OF FOREIGN EXPORT CONTROL RESTRICTIONS

2.1 If, in the performance of the Contract, you need to import into the UK or export out of the UK anything not supplied by or on behalf of the Authority and for

which a UK import or export licence is required, you will be responsible for applying for the licence. The Authority will provide you with all reasonable assistance in obtaining any necessary UK import or export licence.

2.2 In respect of any Contractor Deliverables, likely to be required for the performance of any resultant Contract, you must provide the following information in your Tender:

Whether all or part of any Contractor Deliverables are or will be subject to:

- 2.2.1 a non-UK export licence, authorisation or exemption; or
- 2.2.2 any other related transfer control that restricts or will restrict end use, end user, re-transfer or disclosure.

You must complete DEFFORM 528 (or other mutually agreed alternative format) in respect of any Contractor Deliverables identified at paragraph 2.2 and return it as part of your Tender. If you have previously provided this information you can provide details of the previous notification and confirm the validity.

- 2.3 You must use reasonable endeavours to obtain sufficient information from your potential supply chain to enable a full response to paragraph 2.2. If you are unable to obtain adequate information, you must state this in your Tender. If you become aware at any time during the competition that all or part of any proposed Contractor Deliverable is likely to become subject to a non-UK Government Control through a Government-to-Government sale only, you must inform the Authority immediately by updating your previously submitted DEFFORM 528 or completing a new DEFFORM 528.
- 2.4 This does not include any Intellectual Property specific restrictions mentioned in paragraph 1.2.
- 2.5 You must notify the named Commercial Officer immediately if you are unable for whatever reason to abide by any restriction of the type referred to in paragraph 2.2.
- 2.6 Should you propose the supply of Contractor Deliverables of US origin the export of which from the USA is subject to control under the US International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR), you must include details on the DEFFORM 528. This will allow the Authority to make a decision whether the export can or cannot be made under the US-UK Defense Trade Co-operation Treaty. The Authority shall then convey its decision to the Tenderer. If the Authority decides that use of the Treaty for the export is permissible, it is your responsibility to make a final decision whether you want to use that route for the export concerned if you are awarded the Contract.

3 IMPORT DUTY

- 3.1 United Kingdom (UK) legislation permits the use of various procedures to suspend customs duties.
- 3.2 For the purpose of this competition, for any deliverables not yet imported into the UK, you are required to provide details of your plans to address customs compliance, including the Customs procedures to be applied (together with the

procedure code) and the estimated Import Duty to be incurred and/or suspended.

3.3 You should note that it is your responsibility to ensure compliance with all regulations relating to the operation of the accounting for import duties. This includes but is not limited to obtaining the appropriate His Majesty's Revenue & Customs (HMRC) authorisations.

4 CYBER RISK

4.1 Cyber risk has been considered and in accordance with the Cyber Security Model resulted in a Cyber Risk Profile of 'very low'. The Risk Assessment Reference is RAR 131900429. Tenderers are required to complete the Supplier Assurance Questionnaire on the Supplier Cyber Protection Service and submit this as part of their Tender response, together with a Cyber Implementation Plan as appropriate.

5 SUB-CONTRACTS FORM 1686

5.1 Form 1686 (also known as Appendix 5) is to be used in all circumstances where contractors wish to place a Sub-Contract at OFFICIAL-SENSITIVE with a contractor outside of the UK, or where the release of SECRET or above information is involved within the UK or overseas. The process will require submission of the single page document either directly to the MOD Project Team or, where specified, to the DE&S Security Advice Centre. Form 1686 and further guidance can be found in the Cabinet Office's <u>Contractual Process</u>.

6 SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES

- 6.1 The Authority is committed to supporting the Government's Small and Mediumsized Enterprise (SME) policy, and we want to encourage wider SME participation throughout our supply chain. Our goal is that 25% of the Authority's spending should be spent with SMEs by 2022; this applies to the money which the Authority spends directly with SMEs and through the supply chain. The Authority uses the European Commission definition of SME.
- 6.2 A key aspect of the Government's SME Policy is ensuring that its suppliers throughout the supply chain are paid promptly. All suppliers to the Authority and their Sub-Contractors are encouraged to make their own commitment and register with the <u>https://www.smallbusinesscommissioner.gov.uk/ppc/</u>.
- 6.3 Suppliers are also encouraged to work with the Authority to support the Authority's SME initiative, however this is not a condition of working with the Authority now or in the future, nor will this issue form any part of the Tender evaluation. - 7 TRANSPARENCY, FREEDOM INFORMATION AND ENVIRONMENTAL

INFORMATION REGULATIONS

- 7.1 The Authority shall publish notification of the Contract and publish Contract documents where required following a request under the FOI Act except where publishing such information would hinder law enforcement; would otherwise be contrary to the public interest; would prejudice the legitimate commercial interest of any person or might prejudice fair competition between suppliers.
- 7.2 The Authority may publish the contents of any resultant Contract in line with government policy set out in the Government's <u>Transparency Principles</u> and in accordance with the provisions of DEFCON 539A.
- 7.3 Before publishing the Contract, the Authority will redact any information which is exempt from disclosure under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the **FOIA**") or the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 ("the **EIR**").
- 7.4 You must complete the attached Tenderer's Sensitive Information form (DEFFORM 539A) explaining which parts of your Tender you consider to be Sensitive Information (as defined in DEFCON 539). This includes providing a named individual who can be contacted with regard to FOIA and EIR.
- 7.5 You should note that while your views will be taken into consideration, the ultimate decision whether to publish or disclose information lies with the Authority. You are advised to provide as much detail as possible on the form. It is highly unlikely that a Tender will be exempt from disclosure in its entirety. Should the Authority decide to publish or disclose information against your wishes, you will be given prior notification.

8 ELECTRONIC PURCHASING

8.1 Tenderers must note that use of the <u>Contracting, Purchasing and Finance</u> (<u>CP&F</u>) electronic procurement tool is a mandatory requirement for any resultant Contract awarded following this Tender. By submitting this Tender, you agree to electronic payment. You may consult the service provider on connectivity options. Failure to accept electronic payment will result in your Tender being non-compliant and excluded from the tender process.

9 CHANGE OF CIRCUMSTANCES

9.1 In accordance with paragraph 9 of the ITN document (Material Change of Control), if your circumstances have changed, please select 'Yes' to the appropriate question on DEFFORM 47 Annex A and submit a Statement Relating to Good Standing with your Tender.

10 ASBESTOS, HAZARDOUS ITEMS AND DEPLETION OF THE OZONE LAYER

10.1 The Authority is required to report any items that use asbestos, that are hazardous or where there is an impact on the Ozone layer. Where any Contractor Deliverables fall into one of these categories select 'Yes' to the appropriate question on DEFFORM 47 Annex A and provide further details in your Tender.

11 REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS

11.1 Tenderers are required to comply with applicable regulatory policy and regulation. Acceptable Means of Compliance (AMC) and Alternate Acceptable Means of Compliance (AAMC) are strongly recommended practices and a justification will be required if they are not followed. Tenderers must consult the relevant regulator where there is more than one AMC or AAMC. You must confirm how you intend to comply with the regulatory requirements.

12 BANK OR PARENT COMPANY GUARANTEE

12.1 A Bank or Parent Company Guarantee is not required.
