Invitation to Tender and Client Requirements: Radio System Upgrade

Client Requirements:

1.1 Introduction:

In 1901 Frederick Horniman gave the Horniman Museum and Gardens as a free gift to the people for their education, recreation and enjoyment, this vision still remains central to the Horniman today. A blend of high quality collections spanning the natural, multicultural and musical worlds; 16 acres of well managed urban open space; community based educational and leisure programmes and a wide range of performance, events and activities provide an unrivalled opportunity for a diverse range of visitors to encounter and understand the richness and variety of the World in which we live.

The Horniman' audience is local, national and international and it actively seeks to attract users of all ages, backgrounds and abilities. It is a much loved community resource for London and the South East. It has an exceptional record of educational achievement and works with a range of partners to co-design its learning programmes, events and activities with as wide a range of people as possible. In 2019/20 we welcomed over 900,000 visitors to our site, with over 780,000 visiting the Museum.

1.2 Radio System Upgrade:

The current radio system at the Horniman consists of x72 HYT TC- 610 two way radios assisted by a repeater which was installed around 2015. The TC-610 is an analogue two way radio manufactured by Hytera. As it is built to IP66 standards the TC-610 is protected from dust and it can be fully submersed in water of up to 3 meters. A standard 1200mAh Li-Ion battery comes with the radio itself and can keep the TC610 operating for up to 12 hours. The radio stands at 117mm tall and 54mm wide. There are currently 2 radio channels in operation on site covered by one Ofcom Licence. The second channel is only usable by a few radios, so is not used day to day.

The TC 6-10 radios are no longer available to purchase through nationwide suppliers due to age and reduced functionality. This has resulted in some operational difficulty for the teams on site when one breaks. Although well maintained the current radio system has reached the end of its life and requires full renewal.

1.3 Health and Safety:

Please note that the Security Reception area is staffed and operational 24 hours a day 7 days a week. Works to this area should be of minimal disruption. Any work required in this area will require contractors to show a negative covid-19 lateral flow test from within the previous 24 hours, and contractors will be required to wear a face mask across nose and mouth at all times. The face mask should be rated as FFP2 or higher.

The Museum and Gardens are visited by large numbers of children and families, including school groups. Care must be taken to ensure the works site is secure.

The Horniman will provide access to welfare facilities within the museum at no-cost to the appointed contractor.

1.4 Waste and deliveries:

As part of the contract the successful tenderer is required to dispose of the existing radio equipment and sundries in a sustainable and ethical manner. As the radios constitute WEE waste, they should be recycled and a waste transfer note provided to the Horniman documenting their disposal in an environmentally safe manner.

Tenders will be assessed by Tim Hopkins and Georgia Hillyard. Scoring will be as follows:

Price: 60%

Quality: 40%

The quality score will be based on the following assessment questions, please provide responses:

- 1) Please provide a programme for the delivery of the equipment, installation and training. Please note everything must be completed by the 31st March 2021.
- 2) Please provide detail on your approach to delivering training on the new radio system. **(500 words max)**
- 3) What after sales support will you provide in the maintenance and operation of this radio system? (600 words max.)
- 4) Please describe how you will ensure the installation will work effectively across the Horniman Estate. (500 words max)

Please ensure that you include with your submission a total price for the works identified noting any exclusions. Prices should be submitted using Appendix C. Cost Sheet.

2.7 Alternate Proposals

All submitted tenders must include the specifications outlined within the tender documents. Alternative equipment proposals are welcome but will only be reviewed if submitted alongside a compliant bid meeting our tendered technical specification. Any alternative proposals should detail how it meets the requirements of the Horniman and why it has been submitted in addition. Lone alternative tenders will not be reviewed.

2.8 Supplementary information to be provided with tender:

- Proposed programme.
- Company accounts for the last three years.
- Confirmation of insurances held.
- Company History.
- Examples of two relevant case studies.
- Names, addresses and telephone numbers for two referees.
- · Health and Safety Policy.
- Environmental policy.

A compliant bid, must include the above and:

- · Completed cost sheet.
- Signed form of tender.
- Programme, with completion by the 31st March 2021.
- Completed quality questions.

3.0 Contract Award:
