
Context: Taking Charge

To deliver the greatest and fastest possible improvement to the health and wellbeing of the 2.8m people of Greater Manchester


We will do this by:

- 4. Making sure the system remains clinically safe throughout.





Background: Contracting and Payment Reform (1)

- GM HSCP established the Incentivising Reform programme in January 2016 as one of the enabling work streams to our transformation programme across health and social care in GM.
- There was a recognition that the successful delivery of new models of health and social care at locality, cluster and GM level will need to be driven through new, innovative, evidence-based contracting models and pricing mechanisms. It was also acknowledged that the scope of these would need to be broad ranging covering all sectors and a wide range of providers.
- Whilst there are a number of ways to contract for and pay for services, in GM we believe that there is a case to understand all the existing models and how they can be used to facilitate our new models of care, but also challenge our understanding of new and innovative models to ensure that we deliver a truly integrated health and social care service focused on outcomes and financial balance and sustainability.

Background: Contracting and Payment Reform (2)

- The current contracting and pricing mechanisms may not be suitable to facilitate the level of change GM wants to deliver within our timescales, as:
 - They incentivise an activity-based, as oppose to outcome-based approach
 - They do not address the challenges of risk and benefit share between organisations (especially if the investing agency does not benefit);
 - They do not address the challenges of the delay between investment and investment return, especially when the service models being contracted for are focused more on early intervention and prevention;
 - They tend to incentivise competitive, not collaborative behavior and ideally should promote a healthy mixture of both; and
 - They do not support innovative practice and the translation of innovation into mainstream service delivery.
- The GM Strategic Partnership Board has agreed that there is a requirement to understand our current approaches and develop a clear work plan for this work stream.
- External support will provide capacity and specialist capability to our system in the development of the work plan.

What do we want?

To procure a 12 week enhanced support package of consultancy services to provide professional advice and support to develop imaginative and innovative ways in which we can deliver and incentivise reform through contracting and pricing mechanisms. The support delivered will offer innovative, structured and evidence based approaches and will be inclusive of all health and social care services.

We also need to facilitate the agreement across all 37 organisations that make up the GM Health and Social Care system, of a roadmap and business case for this programme of work over the next 3 years.

Aims of the support package

- To create a roadmap to include a timetable and implementation plan for the work stream.
- To create a business case describing the rationale for the work to be taken forward and to facilitate sign up by all the organisations in GM.
- To provide a repository of national and international good practice examples relating to incentivising reform through payment and contracting.
- To provide a suggested governance for the future of the work stream.
- To propose capacity / resources needed to deliver the requirements.

Outputs

- **Roadmap**: to include a timetable and implementation plan for the work-stream;
- **Business case**: describing the rationale for the work to be taken forward and to facilitate sign up by all the organisations in GM;
- **Repository**: of national and international good practice examples relating to incentivising reform through payment and contracting;
- Recommendations on:
 - the **governance** for the future of the work-stream; and
 - **capacity / resources** needed to deliver the requirements of the work stream.


- Procurement exercise is being undertaken on a Competitive Quotation basis.
