- Gain information to aid refinement of the service specification




Local Care Networks (LCN's)

- LCNs in Lambeth and Southwark; bring together local health and care providers alongside voluntary and community sector and patient representatives
- There are five LCNs in Southwark and Lambeth; aligned to GP Federations foot-prints
- Priority areas of focus for LCNs include:
 - Improving care coordination for patients with complex needs (e.g. 3+ long-term conditions)
 - Developing place-based models of care, including statutory and non-statutory services (e.g. VCS)



Development of a Coordinated Care Pathway


Health and care partners are working with local communities to better join up care for people with multiple long-term conditions



A key component of this pathway is a multi-disciplinary approach to delivering care...


Coordinated Care Training Programme

- There is a lack of multi-disciplinary training available to support health and care teams to better coordinate care in line with the LCN pathway
- Southwark's Community Education Provider Network (CEPN) agreed to commission a 'proof of concept' multi-disciplinary training programme to support staff in the delivery of the Coordinated Care Pathway across Lambeth and Southwark
- Training will focus on agreed priority staffing groups and will be evaluated before a decision to embed the training programme across all five LCNs




Aims and Objectives of the Training Programme

- To support multi-disciplinary learning and development in order to join up care for people with Long-term Conditions (LTCs) more effectively
- To equip staff to deliver the five core components of the coordinated care pathway
- To test a 'proof of concept' multidisciplinary training model with a view to rolling this out across health and care (incl. VCS) staff in (LCNs)



Core Competencies of the Coordinated Care Pathway




Core requirements of the learning partner include:

1. Design and deliver a modular training programme to support multi-disciplinary learning and working
2. Focus on multi-disciplinary learning and the ability to overcome provider boundaries
3. Provide a blend of online, face-to-face and group workshop training
4. Deliver sustainable support and training
5. Engage effectively with provider leads and programme participants to evaluate, refine and improve the programme



Proposed Outline Training modules

1. Integrate care in the context of the LCNs
2. Self-Management and Behaviour Change
3. Collaborative Working, Communication and Care Planning
4. Cross-boundary Leadership
5. Evidence Based Practice and Service Improvement
6. Person-Centred Care
