DFID Pakistan's School Construction & Rehabilitation programme (SCRIP) is providing a grant of up to £60 million to the Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) through the KP Education Sector Programme (KESP) and a further grant of £104 million to the Government of Punjab through the Punjab Education Sector Programme (PESP II) for the rehabilitation and upgrading of existing education infrastructure, including schools destroyed or at risk from natural disasters and those affected by conflict. The Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) has allocated an additional £9.196 million towards the KP component through a Development Partnership Agreement. Thus an overall total of £184 million has been made available for SCRIP from March 2014 to the end of March 2018. SCRIP is expected to help achieve education outcomes in both provinces by providing missing facilities and upgrading schools by constructing new classrooms, toilets, boundary walls, examination halls, and laboratories and by rehabilitating existing classrooms, toilets and other facilities. SCRIP will not construct new schools. SCRIP is expected to construct 10,987 classrooms in 3,615 schools located in 16 districts of Punjab and 5,027 classrooms in 2,297 schools located in nine districts of KP. List of the districts in each province is provided in Annex-A. DFID Pakistan procured IMC Worldwide for implementing SCRIP through an open and competitive OJEU procurement process in 2013. SCRIP is being managed through a series of robust processes. IMC has prepared generic designs for mainstream educational infrastructure e.g. classrooms along with accompanying Bills of Quantities (BoQs), specifications and contractual documentation. They have conducted pre-qualification of sub-contractors and other suppliers. Baseline and technical surveys, bespoke school layouts with the generic design concepts have been prepared for the initial packages. For the next packages, these activities are being carried out on a rolling basis. Schools are divided in phases and packages across the two provinces. IMC has started the construction of classrooms in hundreds of schools across Phase I districts in Punjab and KP. These works are at different stages of completion. Baseline and technical surveys for the next phase are in progress

and construction is expected to start in the Phase II districts in August/September 2016. IMC has developed a Management Information System (MIS) to track the construction quality and pace of work. MIS is updated in real-time by IMC staff visiting the construction sites.
