CONTRACT REVISIONS AS A RESULT OF CONTRACT AMENDMENT NUMBER 5

Amendment number 5 will be used for 3 further stands of deliverables to support knowledge generation and lesson sharing led by the M&E partner as follows:

1. Widely disseminate SPRING lessons on both project design and impact, targeting:

- a. Other donors
- b. Programme designers and evaluators
- c. Programme implementers

Building on existing 'Dissemination Activities' milestones, Tetra Tech will be able to ensure the many lessons for the SPRING profile are widely shared and built upon by many interested parties. Activities under this strand include:

- An 'indirect' approach maintaining the SPRING website with its large reach and audience, adding additional content on evaluations, which includes infographics, interactive datasets and short videos based on the Summative Reports;
- A 'direct' approach attending multiple evaluation seminars and conferences, developing thematic strands for dissemination to relevant parties (i.e. consolidating all health and/or education evaluations to share with health / education funders or businesses); and
- A 'focused' approach directly contacting interested organisations "REDACTED" to deliver workshops
 or seminars that are particularly relevant to ensure the lessons from SPRING are used by a wide
 audience beyond the involved donors.

2. To provide focussed business support, e.g. KPI data collection and use for SPRING businesses, and safeguarding support, etc.

The 75 SPRING businesses were the core of the original programme, and SPRING provided them with a range of TA and support, primarily human-centred design training in order to improve their products and services for use by adolescent girls. This uplift will build on selected businesses' existing relationships with the supplier and provide them with further support and training to ensure they can reach and benefit adolescent girls through virtual training sessions.

The below strand will determine what exactly will be most useful to the businesses, but it is envisioned KPI collection (for use when seeking investment), safeguarding training, market research and business development tools and skills will be featured prominently.

3. To determine business and Prototype sustainability in current Covid-19 context

Building on the evaluation team's work to judge the sustainability of the SPRING prototypes, this research piece will look at the extent to which business still target girls; whether their SPRING prototype is still part of their offering; how their business has been impacted by Covid-19, and how Covid-19 has affected their ability to reach girls.

This research will provide a valuable insight into how girls have been impacted by Covid-19 as consumers. This will give another angle to help understand the full picture of the impact of Covid-19 on girls – it is already clear they are likely to face higher care burdens, longer economic impacts and increased risk of gender-based violence. This research piece will also highlight the needs of businesses that can be met under (2).
