

Appendix 2: Kielder Forest – Rushy Knowe and Mounces

Rushy Knowe and Mounces are located on the edge of Kielder Water, and within the Kielder Forest area, Northumberland. These two plots cover approximately 200ha of agricultural grazing land that has been tenanted. The tenancy is ending and there is the option to retain its current land use or to afforest it. Rushy Knowe is the larger plot to the west, and Mounces is the smaller.

The proposal is to convert 145ha of the site to woodland with a 60:40 conifer: broadleaf mix. There is currently some modest local recreation use, largely driven by the lakeside trails along Kielder Water, which are adjacent to this land area, and visitor paths could be incorporated into the new planting / forest design.

Kielder Forest itself is a highly productive conifer forest in FE's North Forest District, and is England's largest woodland covering 250 square miles. The majority of the forest lies in Northumberland, though some stretches into both Cumbria and Scotland. The first plantings were started in the 1920s and prior to the afforestation of the area it had been composed primarily of open moorland, which was managed for grouse shooting and sheep grazing.










Showing adjacent future restocking (forest plan)










