THE KNOTS LIKE A PIRATE

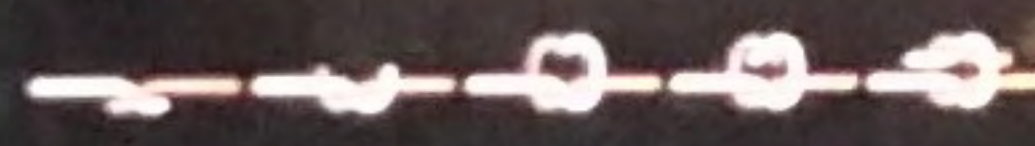

- The Four Knot is used to secure the anchor.

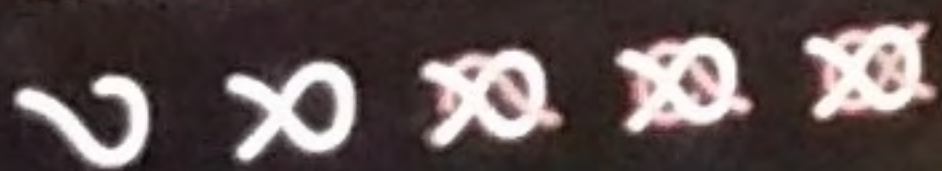
