Background to Mons Hospitality

Project title: Catering for Evening Reception to Celebrate Food, Agriculture and Water Day at the UK Pavilion

Background to the specific work area relevant to this purchase

The UK Government is running an evening networking reception at COP28, the international climate conference in Dubai, on Sunday 10th December. It is hosted by the UK Government's Department of Environment and Rural Affairs Agriculture and Land Use team and the Earth Observation unit in collaboration with the World Business Council for Sustainable Development and the Food and Land Use Coalition to celebrate Food, Agriculture and Water Day.

The UK Government is purchasing a bronze catering package (canapes, alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks) for 120 stakeholders following a COP28 UK Pavilion event in Dubai. The reception is an opportunity to raise ambition on climate finance and private sector funding for sustainable food systems that support people, climate and nature.

Requirement

Mons Catering will operate a catering service at the UK Pavilion for an evening reception on Sunday 10th December, from 18:45 – 20:30. Mons Catering will provide a bronze catering package for 120 attendees, which will include alcoholic drinks, soft drinks and canapes. Mons Catering will deliver the refreshments from 18:30 and set up in time to serve drinks from 18:50 and canapes from 19:05. Mons Catering will provide a staff member to manage food service operations. Mons Catering shall provide its services in accordance with generally accepted standards of care and best practices in the industry.

Sustainability

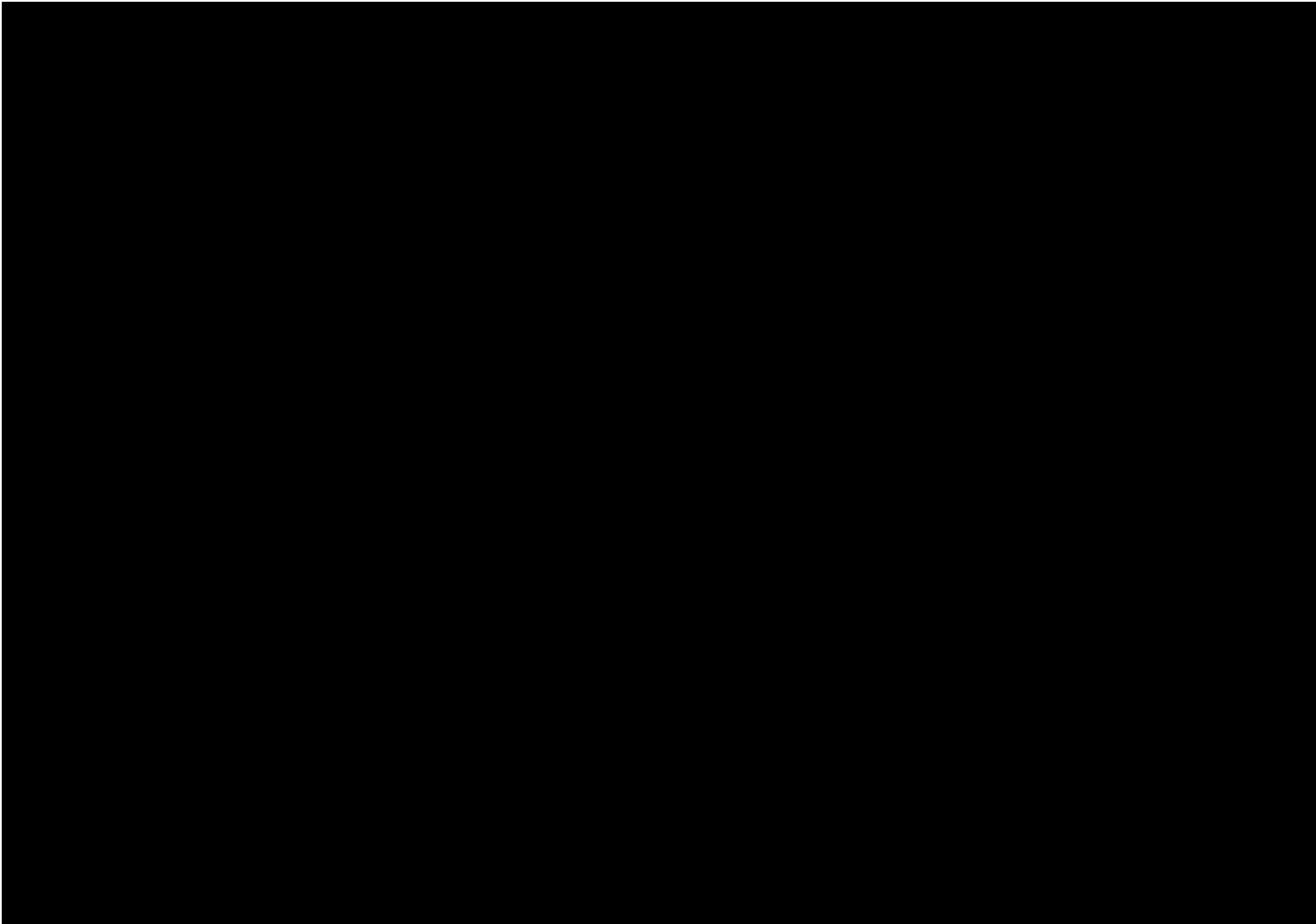
