Subject matter of the processing	This project aims to utilise scores produced from the REF2021 exercise to test experimental approaches to technology assisted research assessment. The processing is needed to carry out the experimental work so the robustness of the work can be ensured and individual scores can be used as a comparison to results generated by any automated/semi- automated approach.
Duration of the processing	The processing of the data will begin once the contract has been awarded in January 2022. It shall last until the 29 th July, 2022.
Nature and purposes of the processing	The contractor shall use a sample of individual REF scores generated by peer review to inform the development of an automated/semi-automated system of assessment which could then be tested against a separate sample also scored by peer review.
	Contractors should utilise the individual scores to help understand the reliability of any technology assisted assessment. Contractors must not attempt to identify individuals from the data provided and should by no means disseminate the scores to any 3 rd party. The individual score data can also be utilised to help train any technology assisted assessment, which shall help answer the main aims of the project. It can also be used to compare results generated by any automated/semi- automated approach with results generated by peer review.
