

# GROUNDWORK BRIEFING

## Great Notley RAFT Consultation Report

### Consultation process

The consultation process looked to get the views of local residents and young people regarding the RAFT concept design via a Groundwork hosted web survey. The survey included the concept design plans that were based on the brief from the client and a previous consultation event run by the Parish Council. The Parish council distributed details of the survey via social media, leaflets to local homes, in the winter edition of the Parish magazine going to every household in the Parish, local noticeboards and via local schools (White Court School, Notley Green School and Notley High School).

Parish Councillors and Groundwork staff were also available to answer questions or concerns during an on-site consultation event on the 16<sup>th</sup> January 2017 held at the community centre. This event was published along with the details of the survey via social media, leaflets to local homes and via local schools.

### Summary

We received 325 responses via the web survey. Of which 105 were entered manually onto the on-line survey by Groundwork. These responses were taken from a paper version of the on-line survey that had been distributed and completed by local school pupils during class time and returned to us via the Parish Council.

- Of those that chose to respond regarding gender (309 participants) 51% were female and 45% were male, the remaining 4% chose not to respond.
- Of those that chose to respond regarding their age group (308) 19% were between 0-11yrs, 48% were between 12-24yrs and 33% were 25yrs or older.
- From the brief addresses details (road names) provided we can see that many of the respondents were from the immediate Great Notley area. However, as we did not request full address details we cannot provide fully mapped details of where the respondents live.

The first question of the survey asked participants to rate the seven key areas of the design as to their importance for being included in the design.

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The three areas that came out with the highest votes as 'really important' were:

- The hangout area,
- Seating
- The goal end.

The three areas that came out with the highest votes as 'don't want it at all' were:

- Timber poles
- Bluetooth pod
- Timber area

There are many comments across a wide range of subjects from both the survey and the consultation event and all notes and survey results are available in the appendices of this document.

They have been broken down into key themes here for ease of summary.

## KEY THEMES

### Concerns regarding ASB

- Bluetooth noise and potential for some groups to dominate its use and exclude others
- Viability and lighting for safety of those using the area and walking past
- Bike locks were requested often for use whilst using the space
- Additional bins
- Out of 114 comments left in Question 2 'If you have any other comments to make, please write them here' around 58 made a reference regarding concerns about the existing and potential ASB for this area

### Hangout space

- Keeping it aimed at teens so no equipment and more seating
- Sheltered space to enable teens to use it in poor weather conditions
- Improve lighting/visibility for safety whilst using the space
- Out of 114 comments left in Question 2 'If you have any other comments to make, please write them here' around 53 made a reference to the hangout space and making this space for teens, this is reflected in the results of question one

### Skate and BMX facility

- Concerns regarding removal of the existing skate ramp, although many acknowledge the existing facility is dangerous
- Out of 114 comments left in Question 2 'If you have any other comments to make, please write them here' around 68 made a reference to keeping or replacing the current skate ramp with some sort of skate/BMX facility as part of the design

Other comments in this section:

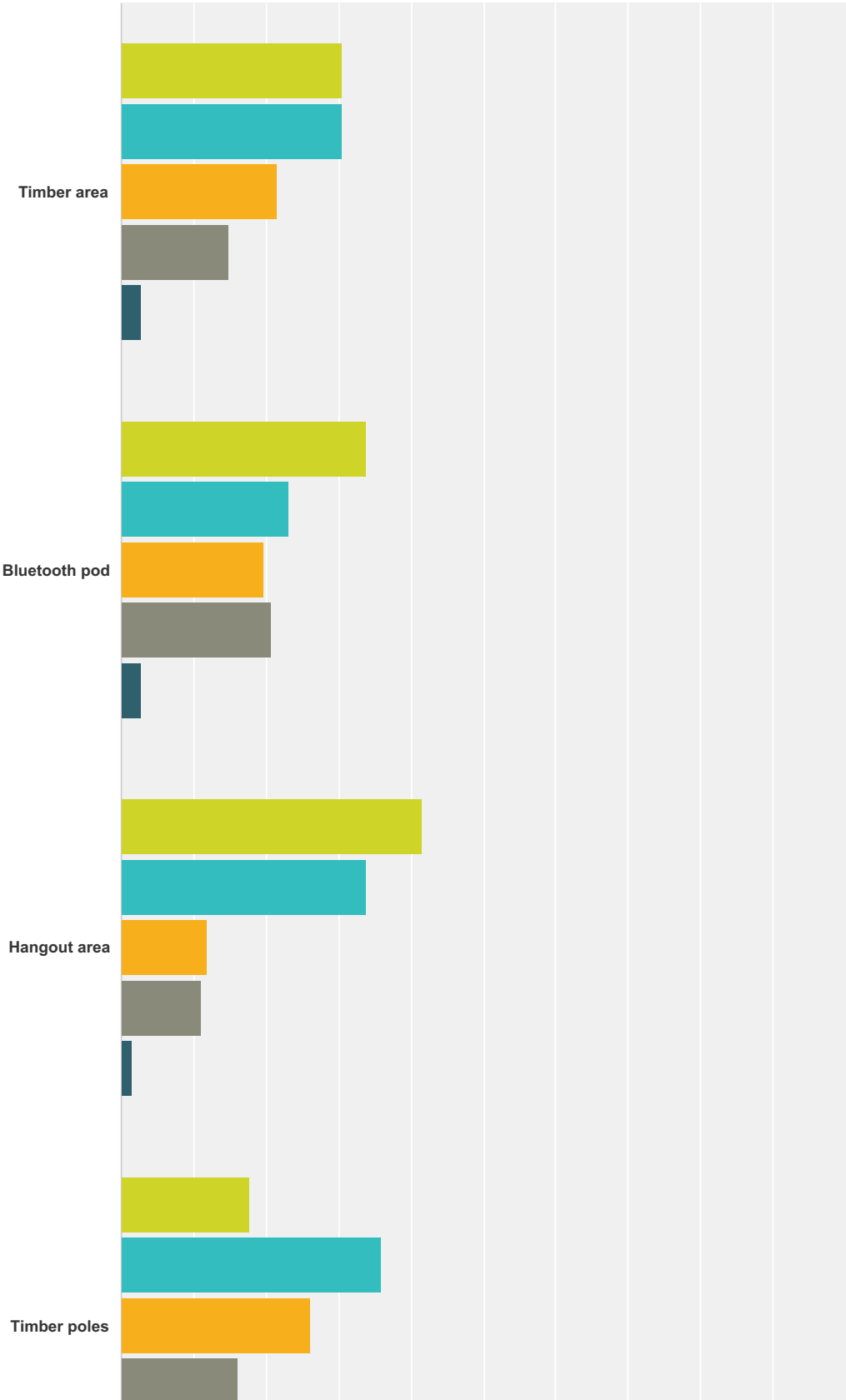
- Goal areas, mix of comments to both keep and remove
- Make sure that seating is provided for disabled users
- Requests for a zip wire
- Make sure it is a mix of uses for the age group not just skate or football

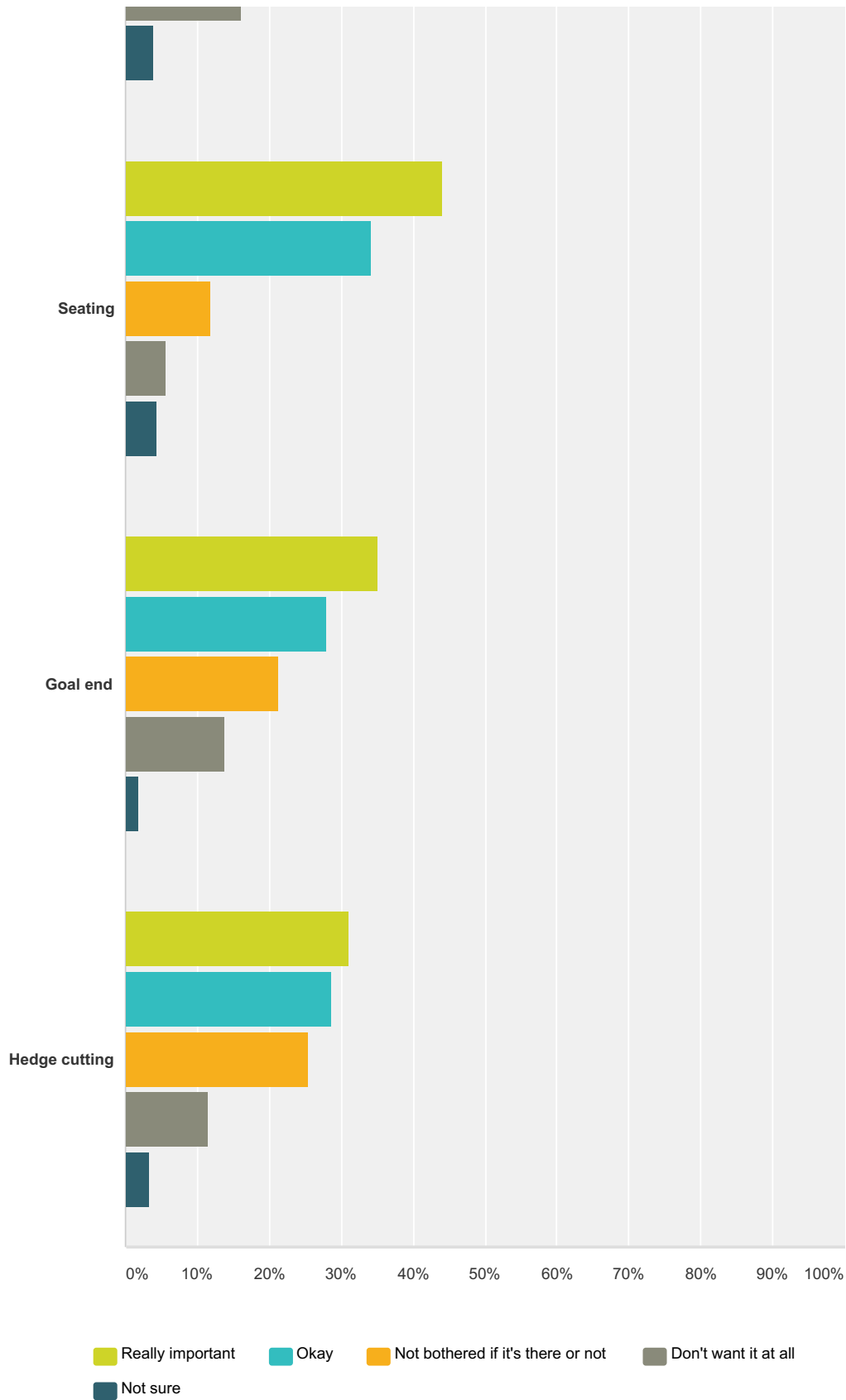

What is needed, is somewhere for older children to hang out without feeling like they are imposing/ being imposed on by young families/ small children using things like the swings and climbing frame, which is exactly what these elements will attract. The Bluetooth 'shelter' is a poor substitute for what was clearly a request for somewhere with WiFi, which is just not possible. Kids want access to the Internet to be able to get on social media websites, etc., not a pointless Bluetooth pod which does not meet expectations and is also not very well thought through with consideration to nearby residents who will have to put up with the noise, arguments and general nuisance from it. If kids want to play music, they can play it on their phones, not blare it out from some useless shelter which will only drain phone battery and potentially make it more difficult for parents to get in touch with them. The term 'shelter' also seems to only very loosely apply to this particular idea, as the gaping holes around the sides provide nothing of the sort! This shows that the council are out of touch with what is really needed, even despite the fact that children were consulted, as you only have to look at the dismal failure of the useless 'shelter' on the green to see that the design of this one is absurd. Kids want somewhere where they can go out, rain or shine and hang out with their friends, even to just sit around chatting, yet not only does the Bluetooth shelter look ineffective, but the proposed 'seating area' is literally just blocks of wood dumped at the side, looking uncomfortable and promoting kids to slump and slouch. What should be provided instead are benches with proper backs so that they are not only socialising comfortably, and therefore feeling encouraged to spend time in that area, but actually able to sit properly (even if it is lazy). While people of all ages love a sit down on the swings, the strange design of these is childlike and off putting, cluttering up the area with timber poles- why? Swinging benches, groups of swings, or something similar, of a more plain and sensible design would probably work better, as single swings can be a little isolating with a contraption like that so close around them. The needless 'modern' attempt at design to make it look like there is more going on than there actually is, just makes the whole area look immature and overcrowded. The hangout/ activity area is a great idea, while the original skate ramp is more in-keeping with residents' wishes, the smaller ramps would make up for this if there was more of a variance in what it offers, rather than just the repetitive 'up the wall, down the wall' layout which will bore kids in no time at all. The climbing features in this area are a great idea, providing something that appeals to older kids, while retaining the love of climbing frames without scraping the barrel of ideas with 'yet another' typical climbing frame.</p>	1/13/2017 9:45 PM

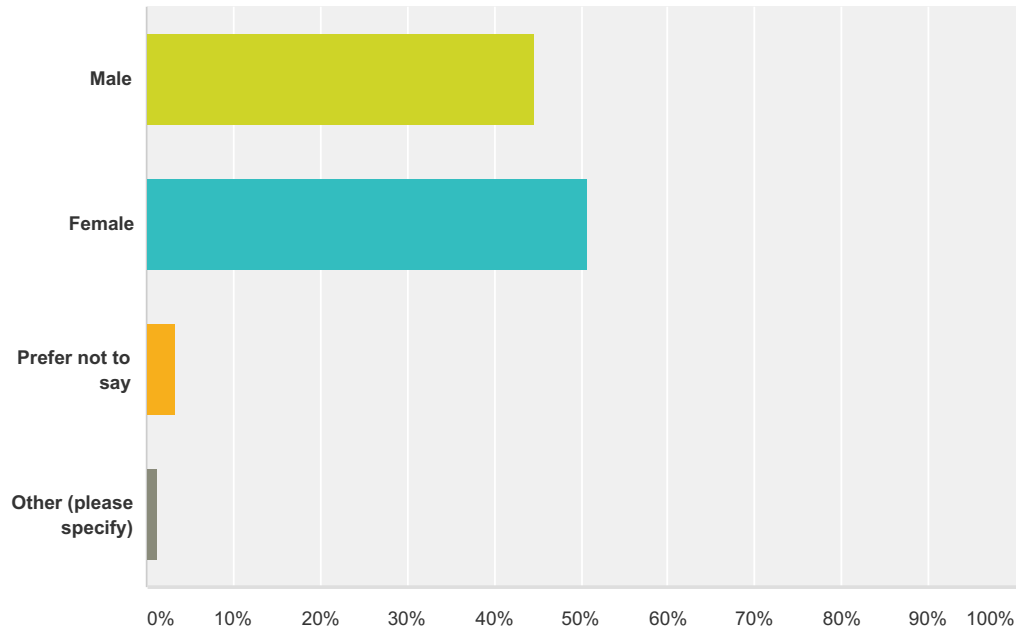

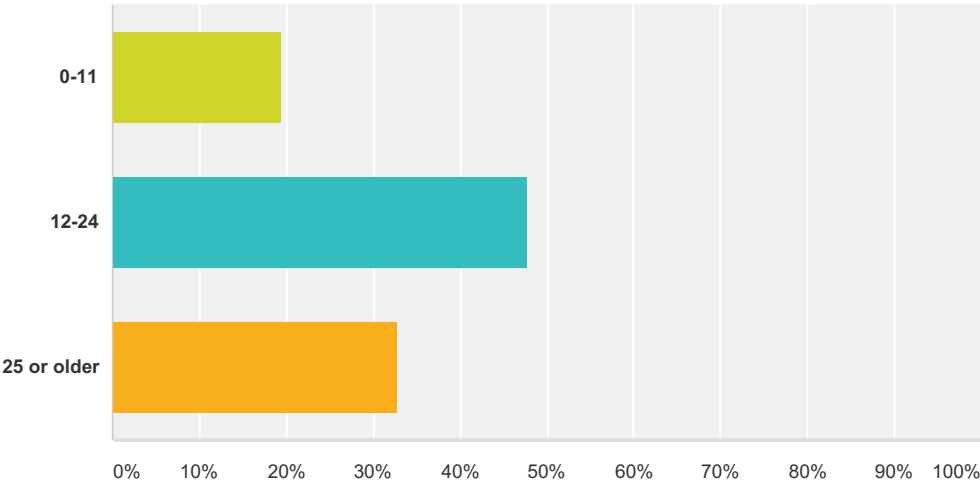
