

Contractors Induction Checklist

Dear Contractor

In accordance with Midland Hearts policy and procedure it is our responsibility to ensure the Health, Safety and Welfare of contractors and those who come into proximity of their work, i.e. staff, visitors and clients.

In order for us to fulfil the above requirement as well as legislative requirements, we require you to be inducted onto the premises of work. The duty manager on site will induct you on all the necessary information you must be aware of.

Please ensure that you fully understand the risks involved whilst on our premises, and sign the declaration, confirming you have been provided with all the relevant information.

In turn your responsibility is to ensure you notify the duty manager of any potential risks you pose while undertaking work on our premises. You also have a duty to provide us with any information in relation to any risks you leave behind and also identify any which were not mentioned to you in your induction.

If you are undertaking any high risk work, you must ensure you have provided us with method statements and risk assessments prior to undertaking such work on our premises.

These induction forms will be reviewed annually or when a new risk is identified or procedures are changed, and you will be asked to go through the induction process again at this stage.

NB: Where more than one contractor is being inducted on the same day and providing that they are from the same organisation, this form may be completed once for all individuals concerned, however a list of their names and signatures must be attached as evidence of the induction.
