A1. Yes the ant hills are to remain.





Q2. Are the boundary hedgerows part of the contract?

My response was the roadside is the responsibility of Cornwall Highways. The Council may need to clarify if any work is required on the hedgerows between the fields and the cemetery (new section). The caretaker and I didn't think this was part of the contract.

A2. The roadside hedgerows are the responsibility of Cornwall Highways, but paths and graves should not be allowed to be affected by hedgerow growth, so some trimming of the internal hedgerow may be required from time to time.
