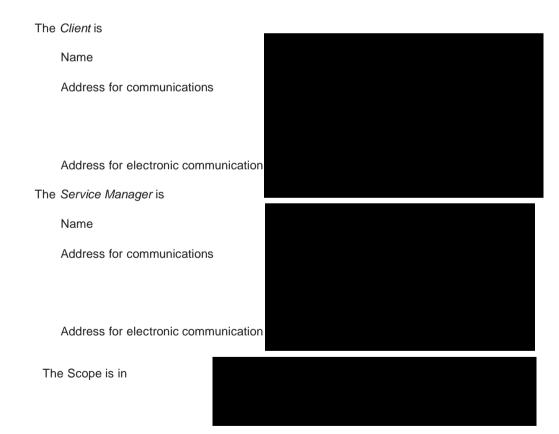

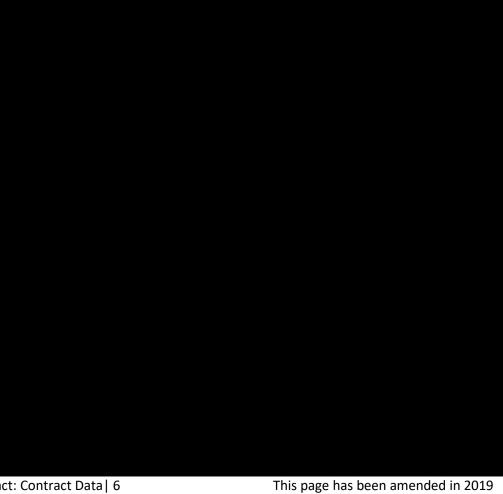

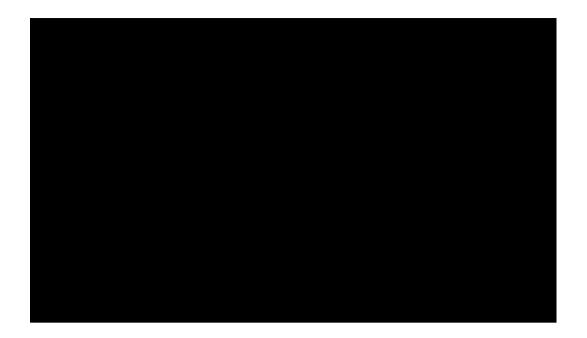

Z1 Disputes:

Option W2 subclause W2.1(4) is deleted. The Parties agree that adjudication under Clause option W2 should only commence if the dispute resolution procedure has been exhausted and that the dispute resolution procedure in the Framework, takes precedence over Option W2.

Z2 Prevention

The text of clause 18 Prevention is deleted.

Delete the text of clause 60.1(12) and replace with:

The service is affected by any of the following events

- War, civil war, rebellion, revolution, insurrection, military or usurped power;
- Strikes, riots and civil commotion not confined to the employees of the Consultant and sub consultants.
- Ionising radiation or radioactive contamination from nuclear fuel or nuclear waste resulting from the combustion of nuclear fuel.
- Radioactive, toxic, explosive or other hazardous properties of an explosive nuclear device,
- Natural disaster.
- Fire and explosion,
- Impact by aircraft or other aerial device or thing dropped from them.

Z3 Disallowed Costs

In second bullet of 11.2 (18) add:

(including compensation events with the Subcontractor, i.e. payment for work that should not have been undertaken). Add the following additional bullets after 'and the cost of ':

- Mistakes or delays caused by the Consultant's failure to follow standards in Scopes/quality plans.
- Reorganisation of the Consultant's project team.
- Additional costs or delays incurred due to Consultant's failure to comply with published and known guidance or document formats.
- Exceeding the Scope without prior instruction that leads to abortive cost
- Re-working of documents due to inadequate QA prior to submission, i.e. grammatical, factual arithmetical or design errors.
- Production or preparation of self-promotional material.
- Excessive charges for project management time on a commission for secondments or full time appointments (greater than 5% of commission value)
- · Any hours exceeding 8 per day unless with prior written agreement of the Service Manager
- Any hours for travel beyond the location of the nearest consultant office to the project unless previously agreed with the Service Manager
- Attendance of additional individuals to meetings/ workshops etc who have not been previously invited by the Service Manager
- Costs associated with the attendance at additional meetings after programmed Completion, if delay is due to Consultant performance.
- Costs associated with rectifications that are due to Consultant error or omission.
- Costs associated with the identification of opportunities to improve our processes and procedures for project delivery through the Consultant's involvement
- Was incurred due to a breach of safety requirements, or due additional work to comply with safety requirements
- Was incurred as a result of the Client issuing a Yellow or Red Card to prepare a Performance Improvement Plan

When appointing Consultants on a secondment basis only:

Add clause 19

19.1 The Client will from starting date to Completion Date indemnify the Consultant against any and all liabilities, proceedings, costs, losses, claims and demands whatsoever arising directly or indirectly out of the activities of the Consultant in providing the services save where such claims, in the reasonable opinion of the Client, arise from or are contributed to by:

19.1.1 Misrepresentation or negligence by or on behalf of the Consultant;

or

19.1.2 The Consultant has acted contrary to the Service Manager's reasonable instructions or wholly outside the scope of the Consultant's duties as defined by the Service Manager.

Z8 Requirement for Invoice

Insert the following sentence at the end of clause 51.1:

The Party to which payment is due submits an invoice to the other Party for the amount to be paid within one week of the Service Manager's certificate.

Delete existing clause 51.2 and insert the following:

51.2 Each certified payment is made by the later of

- one week after the paying Party receives an invoice from the other Party and
- three weeks after the assessment date, or, if a different period is stated in the Contract Data, within the period stated. If a certified payment is late, or if a payment is late because the Service Manager has not issued a certificate which should be issued, interest is paid on the late payment. Interest is assessed from the date by which the late payment should have

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been made until the date when the late payment is made, and is included in the first assessment after the late payment is made.

Z9 Conflict of Interest

The Consultant immediately notifies the Client of any circumstances giving rise to or potentially giving rise to conflicts of interest relating to the Consultant (including without limitation its reputation and standing) and/or the Client of which it is aware or which it anticipates may justify the Client taking action to protect its interests. Should the Parties be unable to remove the conflict of interest to the satisfaction of the Client, the Client, in its sole discretion, may terminate this Contract.

Z12 Waiver

No waiver shall be effective unless it is expressly stated to be a waiver and communicated to the other Party by the Service Manager in writing in accordance with the Contract, and with express reference to Clause Z12. The failure of either party to insist upon strict performance of the Contract, or any failure or delay in exercising any right or remedy shall not constitute a waiver or diminution of the obligations established by the Contract.

Details of the service

1. Project Management

- 1.1. Key stages will form the baseline programme that will be used for performance assessment as the project progresses.
- 1.2. Monthly project updates, updated programme and an Application for Payment will be required prior to invoice approval. A forecast expenditure profile must also be provided on a monthly basis so that the Service Manager can update Project Online (PoL). The above shall be provided by the 10th of every month unless stated otherwise or agreed otherwise with the Client.
- **1.3.** As a minimum, the *Consultant* is required to provide fortnightly informal project updates via phone and/or email to the *Service Manager* throughout the project. Any key decisions made must be documented by the *Consultant*.

2. Project overview

- **2.1.** The project aims to provide support to the Asset Management Systems Team in progressing their Asset Management Target operating Model. There are three main deliverables:
 - 2.1..1. Support handover/transition of the TOM volunteers group and summarising of Level 3 output once all workshops are complete
 - 2.1..2. Facilitation of workshops to develop the PSO unit detail to Level 3, alongside finalising of the P3M and P3O units
 - **2.1..3.** Support initial work to establish the SKE library.

3. Project consultees

- **3.1.** The Asset Management Systems teams along with representatives form the teams involved with the TOM including operational teams across the EA. Part of the transition is for the EA lead to take over the lead of the consultation
- 3.2. Internal Contacts: Lead is John Hunt.

4. Detailed description of services required

4.1. Specific Deliverables

- 4.1..1. Workshop/s with PDO, PMO and Area Programme Team reps to finesse Level 3 detail for PMO unit, number dependant on availability.
- 4.1..2. Workshop with PSO reps to form "PSO" unit. Potentially need two workshops, one to gather and one to playback/gain
- 4.1..3. Preparation of handover summation materials and day to day stewardship of TOM working groups for next few weeks
- 4.1..4. Workshops with SKE leads across business to form agreement/consolidate existing work and form template. Potentially broken into smaller workshops to get to fully formed and endorsed concept with example material.
- 4.1..5. Supporting materials for progression of TOM and linked work
- 4.1..6. Technical Advice to support the AM Transformation work.
- 4.1..7. SKE Gap analysis
- 4.1..8. Establish Corporate TOM link align to SKE, corporate and risk
- 4.1..9. Delivery principles granularity
- 4.1..10. Integrate delivery principles, TOM and constraints to resourcing strategy problem statement

5. Available data

5.1. Target Operating Model

- Detail as developed to date including role definitions, library and TOM material
- Early SKE library work
- AM System literature including FCRM handbook, AM Manual and other processes

- **7.1.** Workshop materials and outputs will be collaboratively produced PowerPoint presentations and where required papers to support EA governance decisions
- 7.2. Some tools may be spreadsheet based eg (SKE Library), as proof of concepts

8. Constraints on how the Supplier provides the service

- **8.1.** Availability of EA staff to attend the workshops is a limiting factor. Notice will be required for key staff to attend
- **8.2.** Some element of the work may be time constrained due to links to the EA work on AM Transformation
