<p><b>Brief Description of Task (or see attached detailed Statement of Requirement):</b></p> <p>The Novel Weapons Pre-Concept Programme (NW PCP) intends to address the gaps in NW understanding and levels of SQEP, across government, to ensure that, as Defence introduces these weapons into the core inventory, NW decision making becomes business as usual. A competent, unbiased and technically educated independent party is required to identify the right stakeholders, conduct a gap analysis between the current level of understanding, or that which could be rapidly generated, against that which would be required for NW decision making to be made as business as usual. The difference between the current level and availability of SQEP and that of which would be required to support those decision makers will also be assessed.</p>		
<p><b>Background/Justification:</b></p> <p>The FMC – Strat Progs – WECA – Novel Weapon (NW) team was established in late 2017. Since then, the team has initiated a comprehensive programme of activity, approved by the NW SRO (Hd WECA). The Novel Weapon Pre-Concept Programme (NW PCP), which spans 4 FY (commenced FY 17/18), aims to get Defence business ready and prepare for the introduction of Directed Energy Weapons (DEW) into core. There are some unique challenges, across the Defence Lines of Development (DLODs), associated with introducing DEW as a military capability as part of the UK's inventory. The NW PCP intends to address these challenges and generate the evidence, understanding and confidence required so that Defence can appropriately consider DEW, alongside conventional weapons, at balance-of-investment decisions. To meet its objectives, the NW PCP is engaging heavily across Defence with DE&amp;S, FLCs and DSTL and coordinating Defence's Novel Weapon activities from the Centre.</p> <p>However, in this instance, the expertise to undertake this task does not reside in-house and independent support is required to ensure that this critical programme activity is undertaken, delays are not introduced into the programme and risk is not injected in at this early point; ensuring no impact on future military capability. To ensure VFM, the secondary objective of this task is to generate the skills in-house so that subsequent tasks and activities of this nature can be conducted without third party support. This will be done in two ways – firstly, during the activity itself, in-house resource will work alongside the suppliers and secondly, successful suppliers will be required to produce digestible, clear and useful reports and deliverables that can be distributed and circulated amongst key departments to provide educational material; developing the knowledge and skills required for next time.</p> <p>Failure to initiate this work will significantly impact the capability of the NW PCP to meet its timelines. Ultimately, it will delay the production of the evidence and understanding required to allow defence to appropriately consider Novel Weapons at future BOI decisions; and as a result, delaying their possible introduction as a military capability.</p>		
<p><b>Activities to be Undertake:</b></p> <p>Requirement: A competent, unbiased and technically educated independent party is required to initiate this package of work. The successful supplier will be required to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Identify decision makers, across Government, who will be stakeholders in the process of introducing and sustaining Novel Weapons as a core capability</li> <li>2. Assess their current understanding, their access to required information and their ability to make informed decisions on Novel Weapons, including with the support of wider community.</li> <li>3. Conduct a gap analysis between the current level of understanding, or that which could be rapidly</li> </ol>		

generated, against that which would be required for NW decision making to be made as business as usual. The difference between the current level and availability of SQEP and that of which would be required to support those decision makers should also be assessed.

## **Appendix 2 to Schedule 3 (Confidentiality Agreement)**

2. Subject to its requirements of continued access to Information necessary to exercise its rights of disclosure and use hereunder including under any Tasking Order, and to the obligations set out herein in respect of any Controlled Information (Definition in Clause 42 Schedule 1), the recipient of any Information shall:
  - (A) Upon the expiry or termination of the Agreement; or
  - (B) Upon the expiry or termination of any Tasking Order (for the purposes of which Information is disclosed); or
  - (C) If the Authority decides not to proceed with the issue of a Tasking Order (for the purposes of which Information is disclosed),in accordance with any reasonable directions given and/or a reasonable request made by the other party promptly:
  - (1) Return to the other party the Information and all copies thereof; or
  - (2) Take such other measures in respect of the Information and all copies thereof as may be required elsewhere in the Tasking Order.
3. The provisions of DEFCON 531 and of this Clause shall survive the expiry or termination of the Agreement or any Tasking Order in accordance with 2(A) or 2(B) or the decision not to proceed in accordance with 2(C).
