


Cobham Hall is visually anonymous – quite deliberately. Externally it looks like a large green aircraft hangar. There is no signage on the building or on the gates. The main Fleet Air Arm Museum is sited on the south side of the B3151 which goes through the Royal Naval air base. Cobham Hall is north of this road. If you are approaching from the A303, the Museum is signposted at the eastern end of the B3151. As you approach the naval base before you reach the main Museum site, there is a small crossroads, where a minor road crosses the B3151. Turn right at this crossroads, signposted SOMERTON. The lane is Stockwitch Lane, and there is a farm on the corner, Stockwitch Farm. Less than quarter of a mile up the lane, on your left you will see a large green aircraft hangar – Cobham Hall. The entrance gates are beyond the building.



Turn in and park – there will be couple of cars parked there. The main door is on the lane side of the building, half-way down. Just follow the path between the road and Cobham Hall. You will be met by a member of the Museum team.

If you are approaching from Yeovil & Ilchester, drive along the B3151 past all the base entrances and the main Museum entrance until you come to the little crossroads. Turn left! **The nearest postcode is BA22 8HN** - the farm at the crossroads.

Cobham Hall is located separately to the main Museum.

It is located on Stockwitch Lane off the B3151.

Upon turning into Stockwitch Lane from the B3151, the entrance gates for Cobham Hall can be found on the left, less than quarter of a mile up the lane.

The nearest postcode is BA22 8HN - the farm at the crossroads.
