### **REASON**

Amendments to the contract for the Study of Early Education and Development, detailed in Schedule 1 Clause 1.1 below, cover funding for additional analysis and reporting to be included in the SEED impact age 5 report. These elements of additional analysis are outside of the scope of the original SEED contract which was agreed in 2013, and relate to requests to produce evidence relevant for current policy climate. These additional elements are:

- Models investigating the effects of PVI and Maintained ECEC usage between age two and the start of school for child outcomes
- Models investigating the effects on child outcomes of the age at which children first started using formal ECEC

SEED has previously reported variation in the quality of different types of early years settings that receive funding from the DfE, and the previous DfE longitudinal study EPPSE has indicated that age starting childcare may play a role in child outcomes. This analysis therefore has importance for policy development in early years and relevance to the DfE funded early education entitlements.

Activities detailed in Schedule 1 Clause 1.2 relate to preparation of the sample of children for whom we have access to EYFSP data through the NPD, using multiple imputation to account for missing data for children not followed up through all waves of SEED. This is in addition to the use of the SEED wave 4 sample for the outcome measures collected at age 5.

Activities detailed in Schedule 1 Clause 1.3 relate to management of the subcontract with Oxford and oversight of the additional work by the lead contractor NatCen Social Research, to ensure quality and consistency in the impact age 5 analyses and outputs.

Activities detailed in Schedule 1 Clause 1.4 relate to the subcontractor Oxford providing the derived dataset and code from the SEED impact age 5 analysis to the DfE. This will enable DfE to internally replicate and extend in future any analysis that has been undertaken by the contractor for the Imapet Age 5 report.

Activities detailed in Schedule 1 Clause 1.5 relate to activities by NatCen to maintain contact with the SEED sample in order to ensure the contact information remains up to date and the sample remain engaged in order to facilitate response rates in any future research with the sample.

Schedule 1 Clause 1.6 sets out amendments to the existing invoicing schedule and extension to the contract end date in order that the invoicing is in line with adjusted project delivery timelines.

Revised costs and invoicing schedules are provided in Schedule 2 below.

Producing the derived dataset and code for the SEED impact age 5 analysis (Clause 1.4) will cost which will be invoiced on 15th May 2019 following delivery of these datasets to DfE.
Maintaining the SEED sample (Clause 1.5) will cost which will be paid over a series of invoices detailed in the table below.

As indicated in Clause 1.6, the invoice previously scheduled for 30<sup>th</sup> September 2020 has now been split into two invoices to be paid on 15<sup>th</sup> November 2020 and 15<sup>th</sup> February 2021.
