BHPC, PC, Parish Council - Bar Hill Parish Council. Bar Hill Parish Council are the landowners for the Saxon Park skatepark redevelopment. They will act as the contracting authority for the successful applicant.

Authorised Representative - A representative of BHPC authorised by the Council. This will be an employee of the Council.

Primary Contact - Distinct from the "Authorised Representative" above. The Primary Contact will act as a filter regarding requests for decisions to the Authorised Representative.

1 General Information

1.1 Procurement Procedure

BHPC is seeking to appoint a single Contractor to work with it to Design & Build a skatepark facility for the Local Community. The design is also requested to take into account the aesthetics and usage of the area surrounding the skatepark. The information submitted within the Applicant's Offer shall be used by the Authority as the means to make a Contract award decision.

The deadline for submission of bids is the 1st October 2025.

1.3 Required Insurance Levels

The BHPC's minimum requirement for Employer's Liability Insurance is £10 million, for Professional Indemnity Insurance is £2 million, and for Public Liability Insurance is £5 million.

Prospective Contractors are required to have in place and provide evidence of all three.

2 Saxon Park Skatepark Project

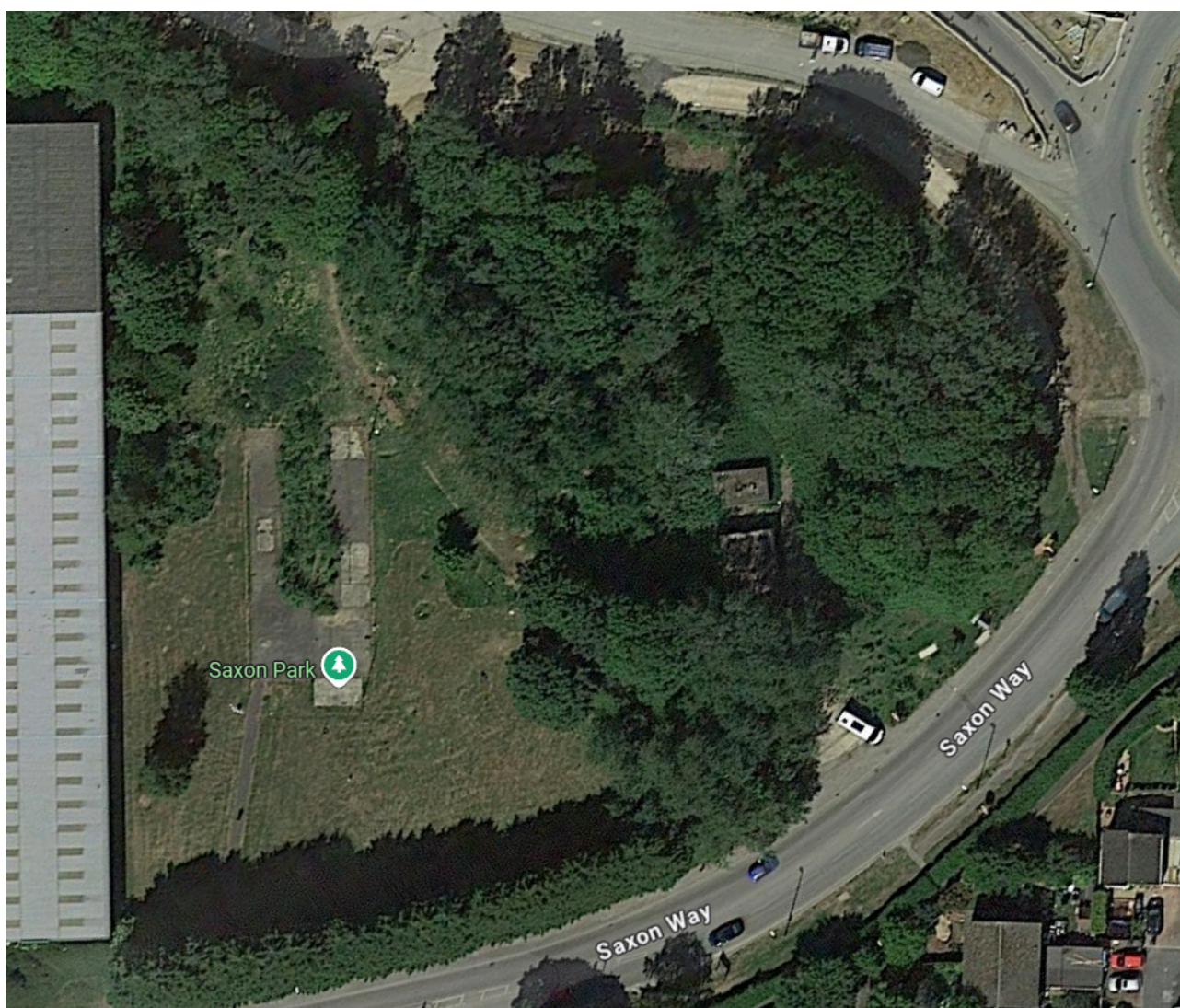
2.1 Background Information

Saxon Park is a site in Bar Hill that formerly hosted a wooden skatepark. This original facility was demolished in 2013, and the area has remained unused and derelict since. The original concrete footings are still in place, though their current condition is uncertain.

The site is now available for redevelopment, and BHPC is seeking to construct a new, modern skatepark to serve the local community.

2.1.1 The Proposed Site

Saxon Park is situated very close to junction 25 of the A14 ([Google Maps link](#)).

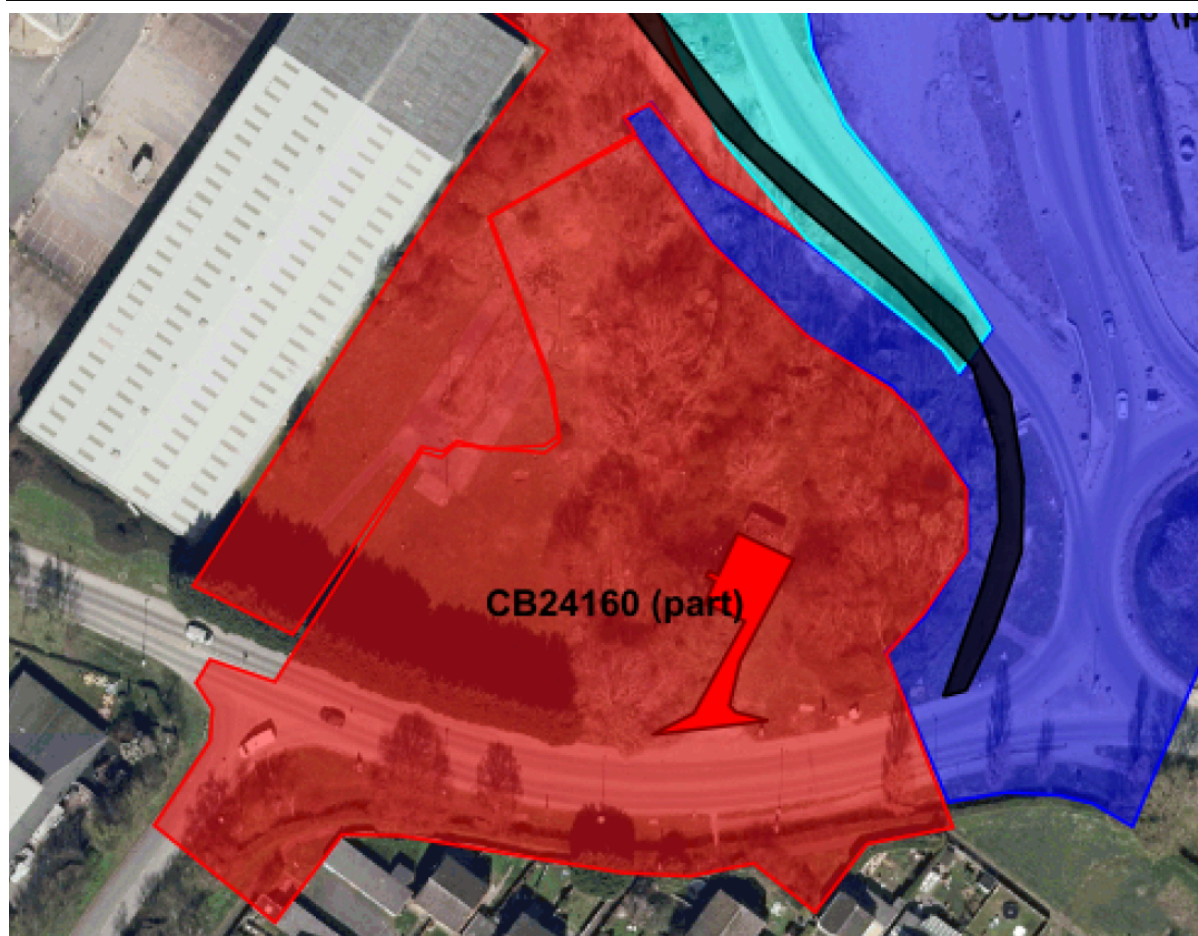
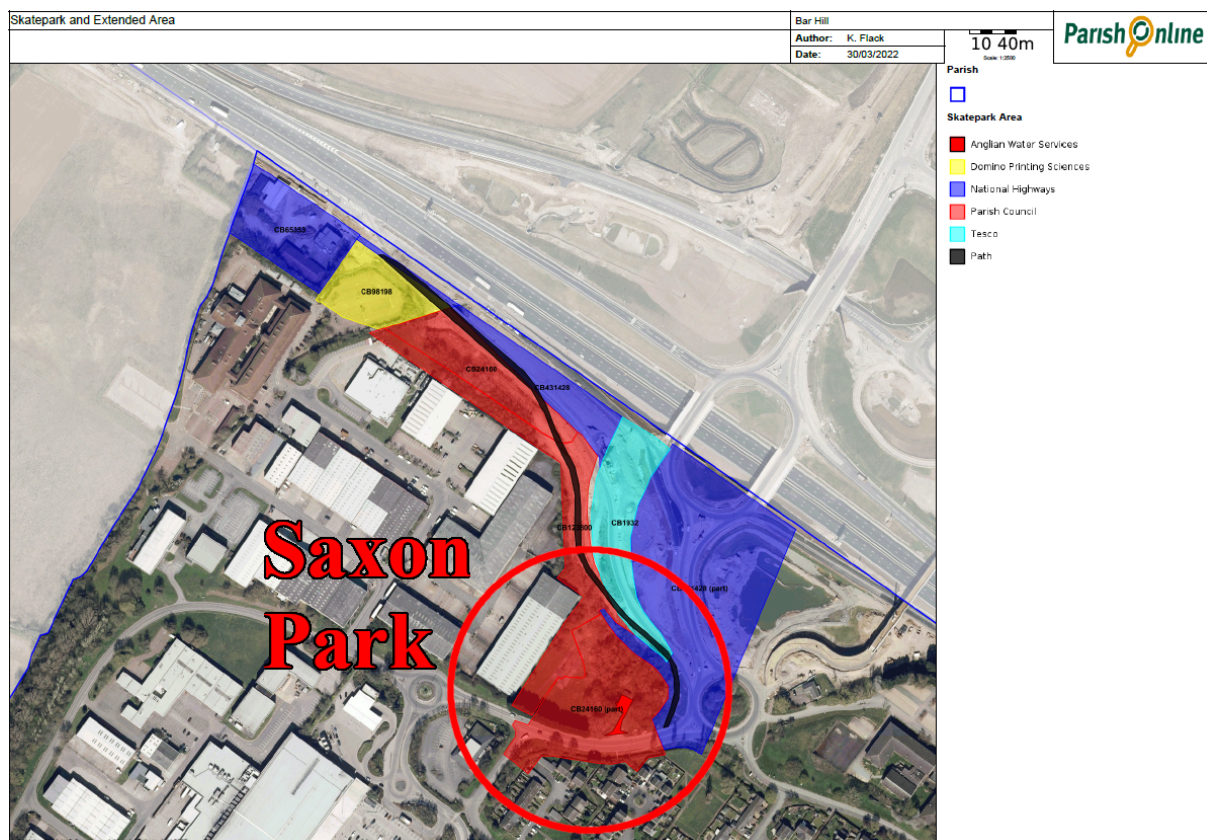


There is easy access to the site from Saxon Way (approximately where the white car is in the bottom right of the image above). It is currently overgrown but could easily be cleared (see picture on following page).

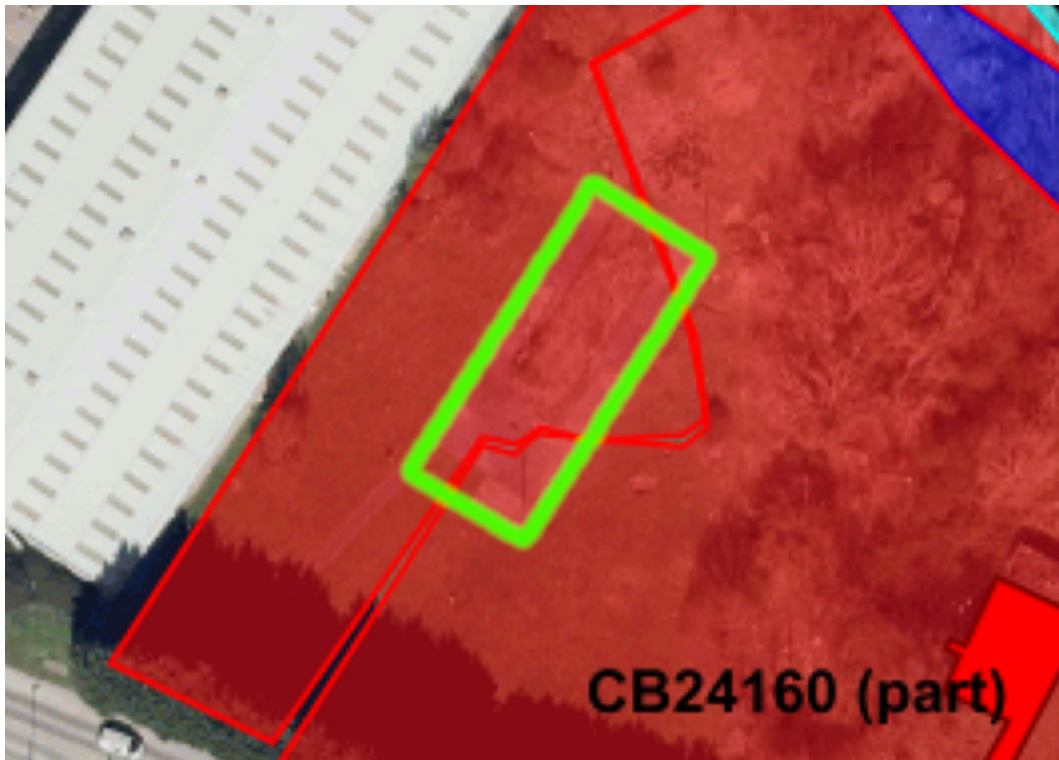


The conifer trees to the left of the entrance are going to be taken down by the Parish Council. Contractors should assume they have been removed prior to any work commencing.

The majority of Saxon Park is owned by the Parish Council (see next page), but there is a small road leading to an industrial building owned by Anglian Water Services.



The part owned by Anglian Water Services is in bright red. The dark blue is owned by National Highways.



The section with a green rectangle already has concrete on. The site has a hill on the east side, as shown by the following picture.



There are 3 old lampposts which are currently disconnected. There was, more than a decade ago, a metered electrical connection to the site - it was disconnected by the Parish Council. The state of the wiring is currently unknown.



There are a large number of trees in the middle of the concrete area.

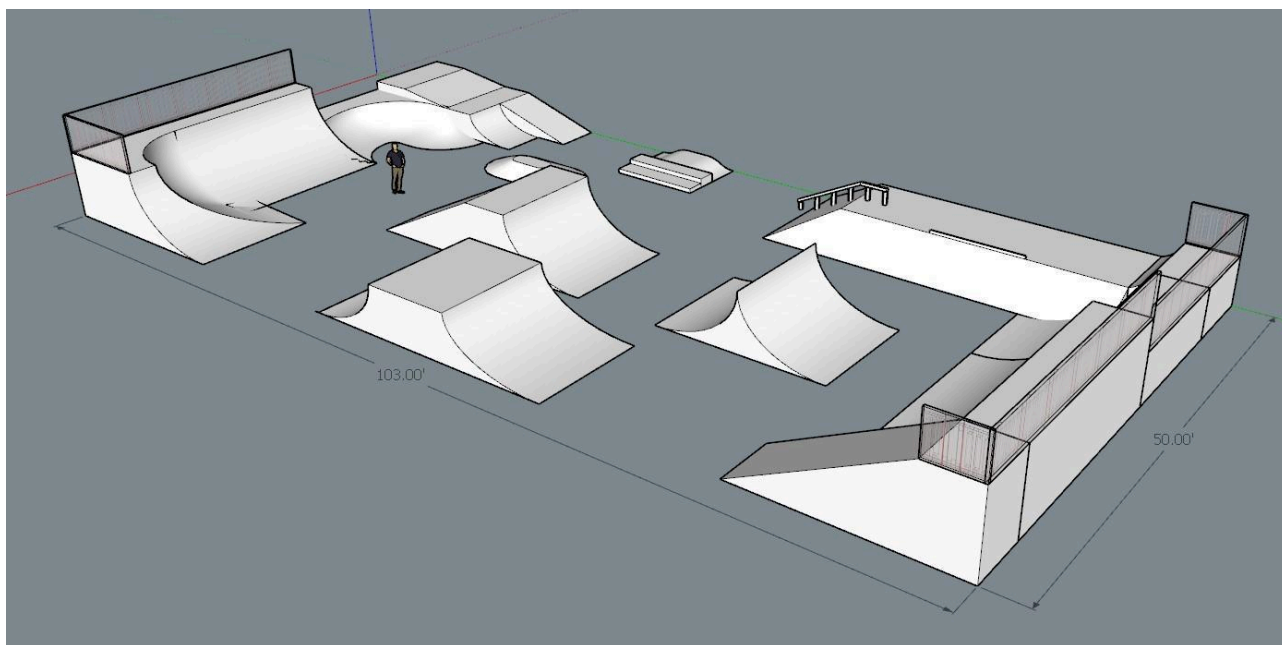
2.2 General Requirements

The purpose of this tender is to identify and appoint a single contractor to deliver the project from community consultation through to final design and construction of a high-quality concrete skatepark. The facility should meet the needs of local people and accommodate a range of users, including scooters, skateboards, BMX bikes, and skates, across various ages and abilities.

The successful contractor will be selected based on a combination of factors, including demonstrated experience on similar projects, financial stability, health and safety procedures, relevant skills, a proven track record of working with councils and community groups, and the capability to deliver a fully funded project within budget.

Applicants must demonstrate value for money, aim to use local suppliers where possible, and provide added value through community engagement, minimal disruption during construction, and a focus on durability, quality, and design excellence. The skatepark must meet both the aspirations of the community and the requirements of the local authority.

Initial ideas and concept designs have already been developed by members of the community. However, further consultation is expected as part of the design phase to refine and agree on a final plan for both the skatepark and the surrounding area. This is an illustrative example of a design that was put together by members of the community, though we recognise that this design would cost more than the budget we're aiming for, so redesign is expected.

There are ideas for development of the surrounding area in the future as a community space, so while the Contractor's focus should be on the skatepark, the aesthetics of the overall area should also be kept in mind.

2.3 Stakeholders

All applications should be directed to Bar Hill Parish Council (BHPC), who are the landowners for the Saxon Park skatepark redevelopment. BHPC will oversee the project and act as the contracting authority for the successful applicant.

Active and ongoing engagement with BHPC is essential throughout the project lifecycle. In addition, building consensus and maintaining clear communication with individual Parish, District, and County Councillors—who represent various interests within the local government structure—will be a vital part of ensuring community and political support for the project.

BHPC will be working closely with three local community-led organisations, each of which plays a key role in the redevelopment, as well as the Skatepark Users themselves:

- Bar Hill Community Association (BHCA) – Chair: Andy Pellew

BHCA is a registered charity that supports a wide range of community initiatives and events in Bar Hill. They are well-connected across the village and offer valuable insight into broader community needs and opportunities for outreach.

- Skatepark Task Group (STG) – Chair: Dave Wright

This group has been established specifically to represent the interests of current and future skatepark users. The STG will act as a key point of contact for consultation and design feedback relating to the skatepark itself. Members include local skaters, parents, and youth advocates.

- Accessible Spaces and Gardens Committee (ASGC) – Chair: Anthony Mitchell

The ASGC is focused on all non-skatepark elements of the wider Saxon Park redevelopment. This includes pathways, planting, seating, play areas, and inclusive design features. They will be consulted on matters relating to integration with the wider park environment and accessibility.

- Skatepark Users – Residents of Bar Hill and surrounding villages

The skatepark is intended to serve a diverse user base, including young people from Bar Hill and neighbouring communities. Engagement with this group—through outreach sessions, design workshops, or feedback surveys—will be critical to ensuring the final facility meets local needs and garners broad support.

- Applicants are expected to demonstrate an ability to work collaboratively with these stakeholders, incorporate feedback, and communicate transparently throughout the project.

3 Requirements and Costs

3.1 Specific Requirements

Submitted quotations must address all elements outlined in the Project Brief and Project Specification. The contract will be awarded based on the strength of the bidder's response to these documents, with particular emphasis placed on demonstrated experience in the design and construction of concrete skateparks.

3.2 Statement of Work

The Applicant must include a breakdown of costs for the Project Work to be provided in the proposal bid. The liaison for this should be the Procurement Representative. A breakdown of costs is required so that the Work in the Project can be associated with specific work elements to enable BHPC to apply to several entities for funding for specific project elements rather than a single entity to fund the entire project. Itemisation of costs for the Project proposal shall include:

- Feasibility study to assess demand, including consultations with potential users (including but not limited to young people)
- Topographical survey
- Support with obtaining Planning Permission (cost of application and any surveys requested will be covered by the Council)
- Project management – H&S and CDM compliance
- Provision of JCT Minor Works 2016 with Contractors Design documentation
- Creation of detailed design engineering drawings
- Groundworks & drainage
- Construction materials
- Provision of modern lighting
- Ancillary items (seating, bins, sign)
- RoSPA Post Installation inspection
- Any other items (please detail)

3.3 Additional Information

The following Services and Conditions shall also be provided:

- 3.3.1 It is planned for the skatepark to be completed and opened within 2 years of the project commencing, subject to Planning Permission being granted and funds being in place.
- 3.3.2 The Contractor will support the Council with the preparation of documentation for a Planning Application. This is perceived to be a **General Permitted Development** planning application under the [Town and Country Planning \(General Permitted Development\) \(England\) Order 2015](#).
- 3.3.3 The Contractor must meet the requirements of the JCT Contract, taking account of any planning conditions and demands that the Council includes within the project management process.
- 3.3.4 Tenders must work to Skatepark GB Design and Development Guidance for Skateboarding (appendix 2) and meet all stated minimum requirements.
- 3.3.5 The Contractor, upon completion of the work, shall leave the site free of any material used and wastes from the construction. Any ground, not part of the completed work that was disrupted during construction, shall be put back to its original state.

3.4 Target Budget

- 3.4.1 The applicant must include a breakdown of costs for the Project proposal. This should include costing of individual items of equipment such that when fundraising happens, the Skatepark Working Party can petition for funding for specific pieces of equipment rather than needing a single entity to fund the entire project.
- 3.4.2 The target budget for the work requirements is £250,000. The Design and Build Contractor bid shall work to this number noting any fundamental changes to the requirements listed above.
- 3.4.3 The Design and Build Contractor may bid in a separate section, options for enhanced design features and additional provision of services for consideration in addition to those required for the principal bid.

The submitted quotation must consider and include the points stated in the Project Brief and Project Specification. The Tender will be awarded on the basis of Bidders' responses to the design brief and specification, with a strong emphasis on previous experience with extending existing concrete skateparks.

3.5 Project Brief

3.5.1 Vision

The location of the proposed works is at: Saxon Park, Bar Hill, Cambridge, CB23 8BH

As mentioned above, the Skatepark Working Party have had some ideas about the design of the skatepark and the surrounding area but recognise the design will need to change based on budgetary constraints. However, at the moment the Skatepark Working Party vision is:

- It will be an inviting and inclusive space that includes wheelchair access.
- Features for all ages from young children to adults.
- It will accommodate beginners who need to build confidence and provide a challenge for more experienced users.
- Features that can be used by: skateboards, scooters, roller skates, BMX bikes and WCMX.
- It will be constructed from concrete which requires minimal maintenance over its lifetime.
- The general Saxon Park area will be an inviting space for all members of the community.

3.5.2 The Opportunity

BHPC is inviting proposals to help us deliver the project. Specifically, they are looking for a Contractor to:

- Provide analysis of demand, which both informs the design but can also be used for securing funding.
- Work with Council to finalise our vision and turn it into an agreed design.
- Obtain planning permission for the final design (the working party, working with Council and the Community Association, will lead the required planning process).
- Construct the new skatepark.

The Council are asking interested parties to submit a proposal to us that includes:

- Details of any design/management fees that will be charged to deliver the outputs above. It may be that your fees will be included in the overall project budget in which case please state this.
- A statement setting out why you are interested in this project and why you believe that we should decide to work with you. This should be a bespoke statement relevant to our requirements rather than an existing general sales pitch.
- Methodology for how you would deliver the indicative timescales for producing designs and costs.
- At least two examples of your work on projects with a similar budget.
- An indicative skatepark design that gives an example of what we might expect for our project.
- Details of appropriate qualifications and insurances.
- Confirmation that you have visited the site and understood the area.

If you are interested in quoting for this contract then please submit a tender proposal to the Procurement Representative.

3.7 Added Value

The Applicant will be expected to suggest any added value that their offer might be able to bring to the Council. Applicants are expected to build any such offers into their submissions regardless of whether specific questions are asked along these lines or not.

4 Selection Questionnaire

Sub-contracting arrangements
