

## NHS England University Health Centre – Lincolnshire

### Background information, geographic and population details

Provision of Primary Medical GP Services at University Health Centre, Lincoln University, Brayford Pool, Lincoln, LN6 7GA

#### Surgery Location

The surgery is located within Lincolnshire West CCG area (LWCCG).

University Health Centre is located in the Lincoln University Campus, Brayford Pool site which is located approximately 0.5 miles from Lincoln City Centre. Patients using this service are predominantly students who, as they enrol at the University of Lincoln, will have the opportunity to register with the surgery.

#### Background

The current APMS contract will expire on 30 September 2016. NHS England and LWCCG will be offering the contract out for re-tender, via an Alternative Provider of Medical Services (APMS) contract and the term will be for 5 years. NHS England has applied for the option to extend the contract for a further 5 years, totalling a 10 year contract, the final outcome of the application is not yet known. NHS England and LWCCG are seeking to identify a provider who will deliver Primary Medical Services for patients of University Health Centre, Lincoln.

#### Current Contract Position

- The current contractual arrangements will expire at the end of September 2016. It is expected that the new contract will commence on 1 October 2016.
- The incumbent provider currently leases the premises from NHS Property Services.
- The contract offered will be an Alternative Provider of Medical Services (APMS) agreement
- Contract offer will be for 5 years, with the possibility for extensions of up to a further 5 years should the commissioner require (pending outcome of application for extension of contract)
- APMS contracts will be subject to all relevant Regulations, Directions and Legislation.
- Staff will be subject to TUPE arrangement.

## Population Growth

There are a total of 18 GP practices within Lincoln City serving a population of 111705 as at 1 January 2014. The University Surgery sits within the Carholme ward of Lincoln. The 2011 Census showed that 6,000 students live in the ward, approximately 43% of the ward's population.

The City of Lincoln Council publishes an annual report. For 2012/13 the report outlined that Lincoln is a growing and changing City. In the last 10 years the City has seen a period of growth as more and more people want to make the City their home. In 2012, 94,600 people lived in Lincoln, a substantial increase from 2002 when there were only 85,500 residents in the City. Much of this growth has been down to an increase in residents aged in their 20s, who now number 19,600. This is significantly larger than the 13,500 residents this age group accounted for in 2002.

The City of Lincoln is considered a 'cosmopolitan city'. The number of students flowing into and out of the City each year helps keep Lincoln a fresh and vibrant place to live. This is added to by the number of people from abroad wanting to live here. In 2011/12, 910 migrant workers settled in Lincoln, from places in Europe, Asia, Africa, North America and Australasia. The attraction of Lincoln as a place to study and work has led to more than 60 languages being spoken in the city. Despite this diversity of language, the vast majority of foreign-language speakers can communicate in English.
