

No family historian should ever be without their trusty pencil, and this one doubles up to help with measurements.





Remember, always write down where you found a piece of information when researching. You never know when you'll want to double check.





This volume is a mainstay of family history bookshelves and is very useful when looking for records outside of the civil registration system. It's such a useful reference guide, and well worth looking over.







If your research takes you back beyond the nineteenth century, then the chances are you're going to encounter some handwriting that seems unfamiliar! This volume has lots of useful pointers and is well worth using to build up or brush up your palaeography skills.



If you're researching a particular place, especially if you're not all that familiar with it as a location, it can be invaluable to be able to check a map of the locality. Books of historic street maps can be very helpful. If your ancestors lived in London, for example, there are various map books arranged by historical period.


