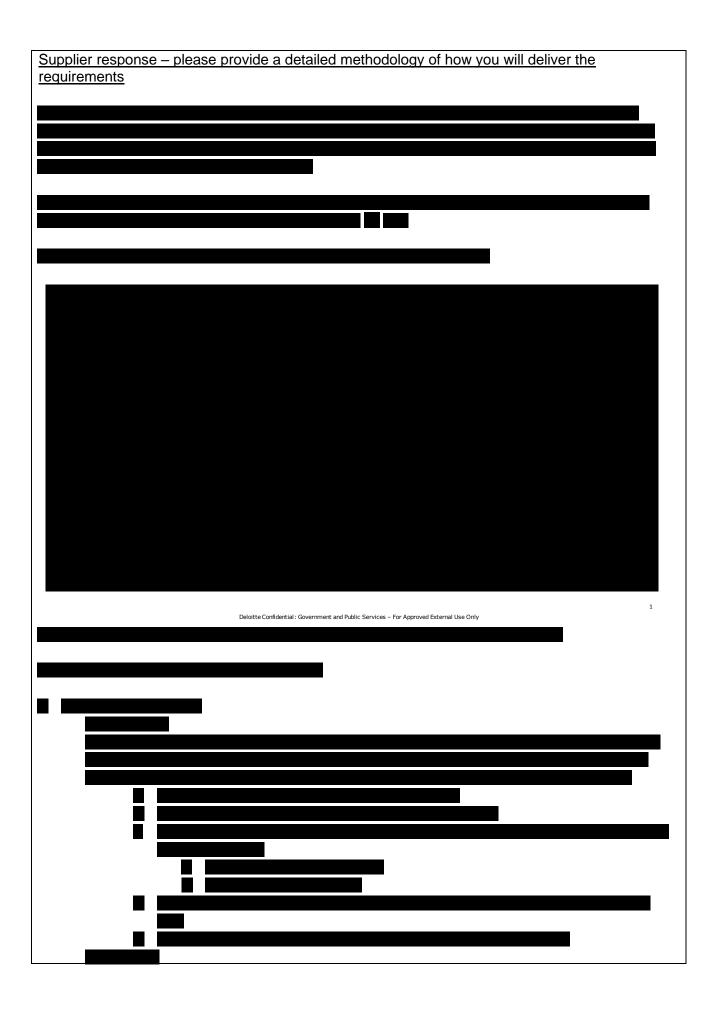

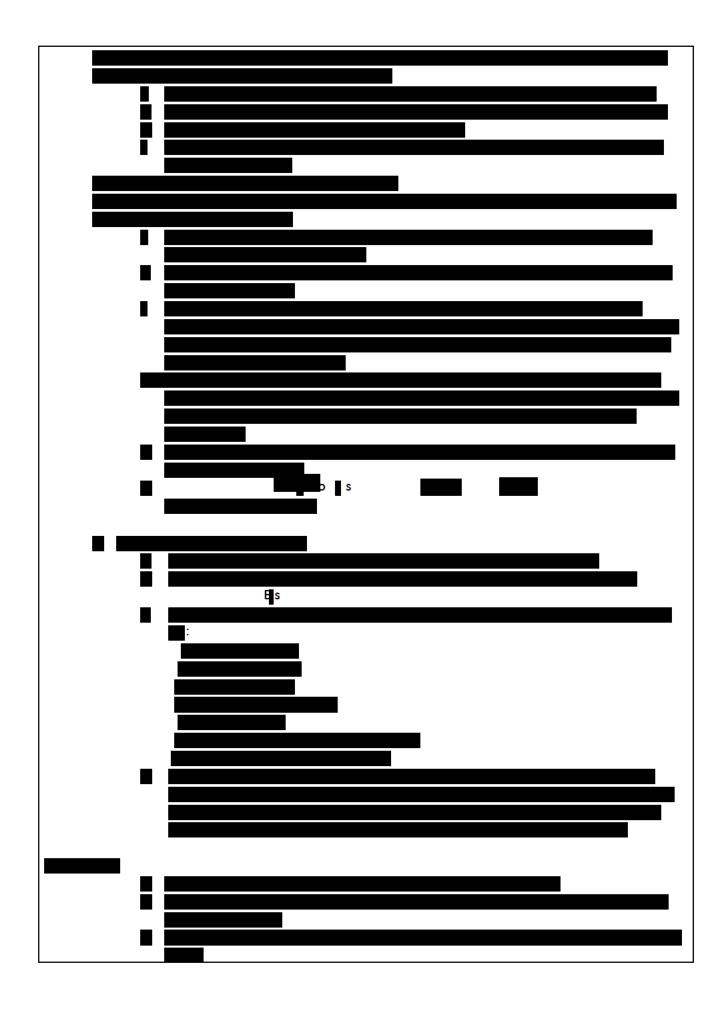
The FSA have a requirement for 2 areas of work in relation to the FSA Delivery of Official Controls Contracts (FSADOC); these are to support the production of a Should Cost Model (SCM) and Procurement Strategy for the retender. This work must remain within the £91k budget, must be resourced for delivery and completed by 31st March 2023.

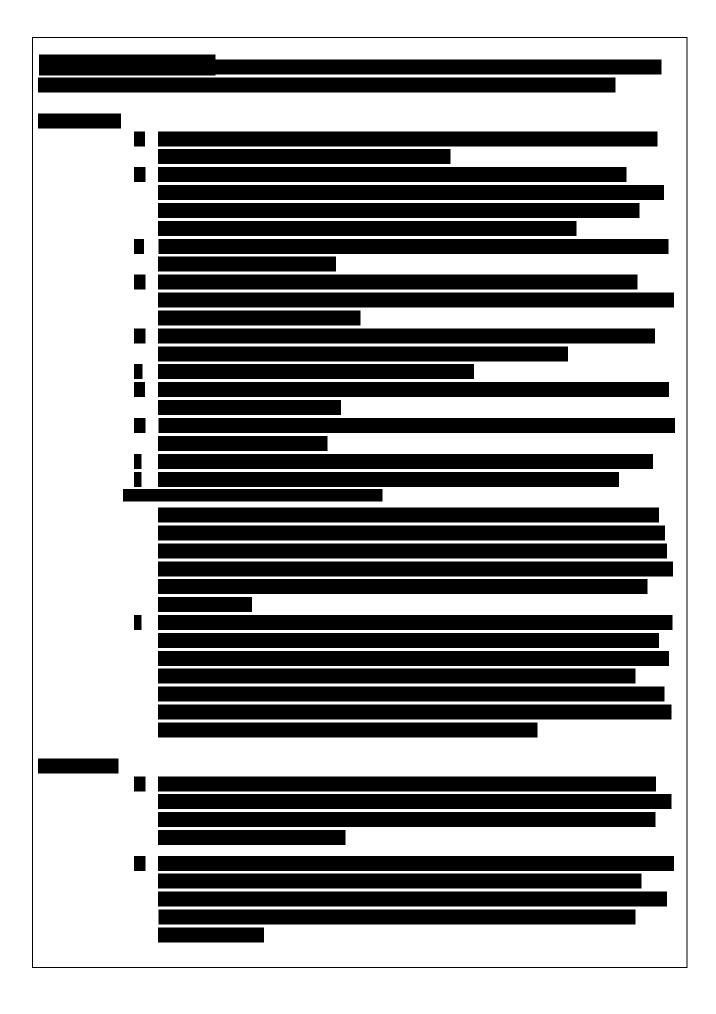
FSA recently agreed a Year 4 extension to these Contracts and are in the process of agreeing a Year 5 extension, in principle with the supplier (E&J), which will require Cabinet Office approval.

Cabinet Office placed an action on the FSA to produce a Procurement Strategy for the FSA Delivery of Official Controls (FSADOC) retender when they approved the Year 4 extension to this contract. It is expected this requirement will be reiterated when the FSA seek approval for a Year 5 extension. The Strategy will need to detail key information such as route to market, pricing approach, evaluation methodology and the retender Governance Structure.

In addition, the FSA want to commission a Should Cost Model (SCM), this is a standard requirement for larger tenders as per the Sourcing Playbook. Furthermore, this activity is even more crucial for the FSADOC retender as we may be procuring in a monopoly market, and therefore need an expected cost of the service as a comparator to help evidence of value for money (vfm). In essence the FSA require a baseline cost model for delivering meat official controls in FSA approved establishments in England and Wales to compare future bids.
