Scope of Works - Engagement Letter

Nature Markets on Government land

Understanding of project brief		
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Proposed works

After initial project planning discussions, we established that a) there are no objectively 'correct' answers to many of these questions, several of which are often fundamentally political; b) that Defra would prefer an output that helps develop their internal capacity to addressing these challenges. Therefore, we propose a project with two key components:

1. Workshop outlining the relationship between English nature markets and the goals in the Environmental Improvement Plan.

The project team contains leading experts in English nature markets. We will run a full-day workshop in January 2025 aimed to provide the cross-government nature strategy team with a) a seminar that delivers a crash course on the cutting edge of academic work on English nature markets, targeting the sub-questions outlined above; b) guides the Defra team towards the publicly-available data that they need to be able to make informed decisions; c) explains the linkages between English nature markets and the high-level targets in the Environmental Improvement Plan; d) provides an overview of various kinds of financial mechanisms for delivering nature recovery on government land, and their pros and cons. Then the second half of the day will be dedicated to e) a facilitated discussion that aims to help the Defra team develop their own conclusions about what paths forward to take in the design of the nature markets policy for the cross-government nature strategy; f) a Q&A session where the Defra team can ask remaining questions relating to the objectives of the project.

Before the workshop, the project team will conduct one piece of original analysis. We will break down the main conservation-related targets of the Environmental Improvement Plan, and using the most up-to-date academic knowledge we will sketch out the interconnections between these goals and the major nature markets in England. The core analysis here aims to show whether the outcomes of these nature markets are aligned with the goals of the EIP, and therefore to what degree these markets can help achieve Defra's strategic objectives for funding nature recovery on government land.

2. Summary report from the workshop.

We will then provide a concise report (no more than 4,000 words) from the workshop that summarises a) key findings from the academic literature presented in the workshop; b) the key areas of discussion and key themes; c) where the Defra team can look to seek further information and publicly-available data to address their questions; and d) the results of the analysis of the linkages between nature markets and the goals of the EIP.

Deliverables

A one-day workshop (venue either the University of Oxford or Defra in London, TBC) with a workshop summary report.




