· Exceeding the Scope without prior instruction that leads to abortive cost

• Re-working of documents due to inadequate QA prior to submission, i.e. grammatical, factual arithmetical or design errors.

• Production or preparation of self-promotional material.

• Excessive charges for project management time on a commission for secondments or full time appointments (greater than 5% of commission value)

• Any hours exceeding 8 per day unless with prior written agreement of the Service Manager

• Any hours for travel beyond the location of the nearest consultant office to the project unless previously agreed with the Service Manager

• Attendance of additional individuals to meetings/ workshops etc who have not been previously invited by the Service Manager

• Costs associated with the attendance at additional meetings after programmed Completion, if delay is due to Consultant performance.

· Costs associated with rectifications that are due to Consultant error or omission.

• Costs associated with the identification of opportunities to improve our processes and procedures for project delivery through the *Consultant's* involvement

• Was incurred due to a breach of safety requirements, or due additional work to comply with safety requirements

• Was incurred as a result of the Client issuing a Yellow or Red Card to prepare a Performance Improvement Plan.

Z4 Share on Termination

Delete existing clause 93.3 and 93.4 and replace with:

93.3 In the event of termination in respect of a contract relating to services there is no Consultant's share.

Z6 The Schedule of Cost Components

The rates and costs in this contract shall be compliant with CCS CPS framework (RM6165) (including Schedule 11 *Framework Prices*).

Z7 Linked contracts

Issues requiring redesign or rework on this contract due to a fault or error of the *Consultant* under this contract or a previous contract will neither be an allowable cost under this contract or any subsequent contract, nor will it be a Compensation event under this contract or any subsequent contract under this project or programme.

Z8 Requirement for Invoice

Insert the following sentence at the end of clause 51.1:

The Party to which payment is due submits an invoice to the other Party for the amount to be paid within one week of the Service Manager's certificate.

Delete existing clause 51.2 and insert the following:

51.2 Each certified payment is made by the later of

one week after the paying Party receives an invoice from the other Party and

• three weeks after the assessment date, or, if a different period is stated in the Contract Data, within the period stated. If a certified payment is late, or if a payment is late because the *Service Manager* has not issued a certificate which should be issued, interest is paid on the late payment. Interest is assessed from the date by which the late payment should have been made until the date when the late payment is made, and is included in the first assessment after the late payment is made.

Z9 Conflict of Interest

The Consultant immediately notifies the *Client* of any circumstances giving rise to or potentially giving rise to conflicts of interest relating to the *Consultant* (including without limitation its reputation and standing) and/or the *Client* of which it is aware or which it anticipates may justify the Client taking action to protect its interests. Should the Parties be unable to remove the conflict of interest to the satisfaction of the *Client*, the *Client*, in its sole discretion, may terminate this Contract.

Z12 Waiver

No waiver shall be effective unless it is expressly stated to be a waiver and communicated to the other Party by the *Service Manager* in writing in accordance with the Contract, and with express reference to Clause Z12. The failure of either party to insist upon strict performance of the Contract, or any failure or delay in exercising any right or remedy shall not constitute a waiver or diminution of the obligations established by the Contract.

Z125 Limitation of Liability

Under clause 87.1; after the fourth bullet point; insert the additional bullet points:

• loss of or damage to the *Client's* property, to the sum that the *Consultant* is required to insure under the contract in respect of such loss or damage,

1 Overview

1.1 Background

The Environment Agency (Wessex Area) is the Undertaker for Tubbs Bottom Reservoir, South of Iron Acton, South Gloucestershire. It currently falls under the Statutory Regulation of the Reservoirs Act 1975 (RA 1975). Within this Scope the Environment Agency is variously referred to as the *Client*.

The Environment Agency is also the enforcement authority for the Reservoirs Act 1975 in England. As the organisation is both an Undertaker and the regulator it is essential that our operational teams manage the reservoirs under their control in full compliance with the RA 1975 at all times. This includes the meeting of statutory deadlines.

The Tubbs Bottom Washland Flood Storage Reservoir was constructed between 1981 and 1982 for the Wessex Water Authority and is situated on the Bristol Frome between Yate and Frampton Cotterrell. The reservoir provides flood alleviation to downstream areas towards and into Bristol, including Broadmead shopping district. The reservoir has a stated capacity of 882 700 m³ and a surface area of 587 000m² when full to its top water level of 57.0m AOD. The dam crest functions as the sole spillway. The ownership of the dam and associated infrastructure is now with the Environment Agency, as the Undertaker for the reservoir. Typical lifespan for such dams is in excess of 100 years.

The Section 10 report dated 12 June 2023 identified two Measures in the Interest of Safety (MIOS) items, both of which (stability study and flood study) have since been carried into effect (certified 02 April 2024). The flood study, concluded that the anticipated still water level in both the Design Flood and Safety Check Floods was found to significantly exceed the level of the crest of the dam, highlighting the risk of overtopping failure.

The flood study recommended that improvements be made due to the risk of erosion in higher order events. The Project was required to undertake an option study to identify works to mitigate risk of erosion. Failure to carry such measures into effect would expose the Undertaker to legal enforcement

under the Reservoirs Act. An Options Study has been completed and concluded that further works are required to protect a section of the reservoir as this section relies on the clay core for water retention and therefore poses a significant risk to the integrity of the dam in a significant overtopping event. Breaching of the clay core due to erosion would lead to an uncontrolled release of water from the reservoir, threatening life and property downstream. The vulnerability of this section therefore needs to be addressed to ensure the dam can safely withstand overtopping during extreme flood events, and to provide a means to either limit the velocities over this section of the dam or increase the erosion resistance of the slope reviewed.
