3. Scope

3.1 Aims and objectives of service

The aim of the service is to provide non-clinical environment drop in sessions which enables mothers to access both social support and expert advice and resources. The service provides a qualified and licensed Breastfeeding Counsellor who facilitates the Baby Café across 4 venues for 6.5 hours a week, over 48 weeks.

The objectives are:

- To provide a drop in centre to support breastfeeding mothers on how to breastfeed
- To provide information and support to mothers and families

- To provide breastfeeding, practical and problem solving support by covering difficulty and issues faced by new parents, including baby feeding, and provide an opportunity to discuss concerns, share experiences and ideas;
- To provide informal education and practical breastfeeding support programmes delivered by both health professionals/practitioners and peer supporters in accordance with local population needs.
- To provide a skilled 1:1 breastfeeding service and social support
- To signpost mothers to other support services within and around neighbouring boroughs

3.2 Service description/care pathway

To promote the service and maximise referrals through health professionals including Midwives, GP surgeries, on hospital wards and Health Visitors.

The service will be delivered by XXX breastfeeding trained counsellors based in the community and will service specifically local women breastfeeding.

Breastfeeding trained counsellors will take the lead role for ensuring help in all aspects of breastfeeding from preliminary to ending and all the variations in between in a relaxed, informal atmosphere through:

- listening to mums, provide advice to help build confidence.
- · facilitation of each session
- one-to-one help from trained staff
- books, leaflets and DVDs
