Aim and Objectives of the requirement:	To procure the following service from FERA:

	The very real threat posed by invasive non-native species continues to be one of the biggest environmental threats to biodiversity in overseas territories, having a significant economic impact on tourism, agriculture and forestry. Providing this service would help meet our commitments set out in the 25 Year Environment Plan, specifically taking action to recover threatened, iconic or economically important species of animals, plants and fungi and, where possible, to prevent human-induced extinction or loss of known threatened species in England and the Overseas Territories.
	In addition, it would also contribute to improving OTs' ability to meet international obligations to protect biodiversity, including under the Convention on Biological Diversity and UN Sustainable Delivery Goals.
Policy Rationale:	The UKOTs are recognised as having a rich biodiversity that is under serious threat from invasive non-native species. Preventing the establishment of invasive alien species in the UKOTs is a strategic priority set out in the <i>UK Overseas</i> <i>Territories Biodiversity Strategy</i> . This project also supports Objective 4 – Protection (being better protected against invasive non-native species) in <i>Defra's Strategy to 2020</i> and the <i>GB Non-Native Species Strategy</i> .
