1.0	Introduction
1.1	Peterborough City Council (PCC) and Cambridgeshire County Council (CCC) have received funding from the CCG to coordinate the training requirements of Providers supporting the Transforming Care cohort of service users, to ensure the local workforce, is skilled to meet the complex needs of this group of service users.
1.2	PCC and CCC requires training providers to develop and deliver bespoke training to support workers employed by social care providers across Peterborough and Cambridgeshire as well as adult social care staff employed by both authorities.
1.3	It is intended to provide 5 online training courses which need to cover: • Forensic awareness • Positive Behavioural Support – Positive approaches to challenging behaviour • Pathological Demand Avoidance awareness • Learning disability, autism and mental health • Communication
1.4	Training is scheduled from the end of January 2021 to the beginning of April 2021.

10.2	The most economically advantageous tender will be awarded this contract. An anticipated start date is January 2021. Award of contract will be on the basis that the winning bidder has excellent knowledge of the subject matter.
10.3	 Evidence that the training provider has excellent knowledge of the proposed course they intend to develop and deliver and has adequately qualified and experienced trainers available to meet the requirements of this specification. Evidence that the training provider can undertake the delivery of this contract within the specified timescales. Evidence that the training provider has access to an online training platform. Evidence of relevant policies and adherence to legislative requirements outlined in this specification. Implementation plan identifying how training will be delivered within the timescales detailed within this Specification. Completion of the pricing schedule Submissions should not exceed 4 sides of A4 (font Calibri, size 11). Answers that exceed this limit will be cropped (excess words over the word count will not be assessed or evaluated). The only exception to this is where words have been specifically stated not to be included within the page limit; for example, if the Authority requests a document in support of a response and specifically advises that this document is excluded from the page limit.

10.4	The Quality element of the submission will be scored based on the providers response to the
	requirements outlined in Section 10.3.
	Minimum Quality: Bidders MUST be aware that, regardless of their price, to be considered for
	award of this contract they must achieve a qualitative evaluation score of no less
	than 60 % (Total Score Available being 100%).
	The price element of the Bid will be scored following evaluation of the quality elements and
	only those achieving the minimum quality threshold score of 60% or higher will have
	their price submission evaluated. The Bidder's price will be ranked, with the lowest
	price ranked highest, for all Bidders who have scored the minimum quality threshold
	of 60% or higher. For the avoidance of doubt the winning bid will be the bid that
	has met or exceeded the quality threshold of 60% and submitted the lowest price of
	those suppliers that met/exceeded the threshold of 60%.

Appendix 1 Learning outcomes

Mental health and Learning Disability/ Autism

- To understand what good mental health is
- Develop an understanding of mental disorder,
- Develop an understanding of indicators of poor mental health with adults with Autistic spectrum conditions and learning disabilities.
- Develop an understanding of the range of mental health problems and treatments
- Promoting good mental health

Forensic awareness

- Develop an understanding of risk assessment, management and public protection processes in relation to harm to self and others.
- Develop an understanding of relevant legal frameworks, including Human Rights and Equality legislation, Mental Health and Mental Capacity Legislation, Including parts 2 and 3 of the MHA 1983
- Develop an understanding of learning disability and autistic spectrum disorders and offending behaviour.
- An introduction to the criminal justice system

Communication

- Develop an understanding and application of communication differences for autistic people with sensory sensitivities.
- Develop an understanding and application of the role of specific communication methods such as: Makaton, TECCH techniques, visual timelines, social stories, symbols, Applied Behaviour Analysis, Team TEACH.
- Develop a greater understanding of issues autistic people may have with communication and practical advice on ways to communicate with autistic people.
- How to involve and make best use of the knowledge and expertise of the individual and family member or carer.
