# **Description**

# Safety of Women at Night Fund

The Secretary of State for the Home Department (the "Authority"), acting through the Neighbourhood Crime Unit, intends to make an amount up to £5,000,000 of grant funding available. Approximately £0.5M of the funding will be reserved for support to successful areas, evaluation and other activity to support delivery of the fund, with the remaining £4.5M available to Local Authorities, Police and Crime Commissioners (PCCs) in England and Wales, the Chief Constable of the British Transport Police, and civil society (charities, community and voluntary organisations, social enterprises and cooperatives) to submit a bid. This funding will be granted during 2021-22 financial year and all allocations must be spent by 31 March 2022. The Funding is to be awarded through a fair, open and transparent competition by means of a Call for Proposals and will support bidders to invest in

interventions to improve the safety of women in public spaces at night, including in the night-time economy.

#### The main aims of the fund are:

- Reduce incidents of violence against women and girls (VAWG) in public spaces at night, including in the night-time economy.
- Reduce the fear of VAWG and improve feelings of safety in public spaces at night, including in the night-time economy.
- Build an evidence base for what works in improving women's safety in public spaces at night, including in the night-time economy.

Bidders will be required to consult with local or national VAWG stakeholders as well as public organisations responsible for women and girls within the geographical range of the bid such as colleges, universities, or local businesses

Each PCC, local authority or civil society organisation and the BTP will be eligible to submit one bid per organisation.

The Fund will sit alongside the £25m third round of the Safer Streets Fund launched on 3 June 2021. Please see the Guidance for Bidders published on Gov.Uk or

contact <u>saferstreets@homeoffice.gov.uk</u> for more information. Should they deem it appropriate, bidders are able to submit proposals into both funds provided they are significantly different. If bidders apply to both schemes, they must clearly outline how the proposals differ to avoid bids being rejected.

The deadline for all bids is midnight on 1 September 2021.

The process leading to the award of the grant will be administered using the Home Office eSourcing portal. To take part in this grant funding opportunity please see the notice below which provides important instructions for registration on the portal. Please read all information in this notice carefully. #### NOTICE TO SUPPLIERS

In December 2016, the Cabinet Office launched its minimum standards for government grants: These include the requirement that competition should be the default option when considering award of grant funding. To comply, the Home Office has decided to manage its competitions using their Jaggaer eSourcing portal.

• How to register?

Bidders should be approved for usage within 24 hours of registering on the system.

After clicking on the eSourcing portal link, it should take you to the home page. On the left-hand side of this page, just below the login boxes, there is an option to register.

• the full legal name of your organisation

- your DUNS number a unique nine-digit number provided to organisations free of charge by Dun & Bradstreet
- profile information describing your organisation and the size of your business
