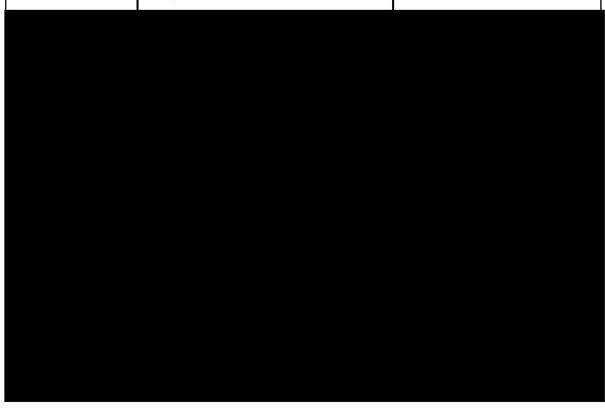

Service Credits and/or Other Incentives
