1. INTRODUCTION

This document is designed to ensure that all potential Artists are provided with sufficient information to understand and respond to the requirements of RBG Kew (Kew), ensure that a consistent level of information is obtained from each prospective Artist and provide a structured framework for the subsequent evaluation of each Artist's submitted Expression of Interest (EOI). It is important therefore that you provide all the information asked for in the format and order specified.

2. COMMUNICATIONS

All communications with Kew, including the submission of your EOI must be conducted via the DEFRA Bravo tendering portal. No hard copy documents will be issued to Artists.

3. CONTRACT

Kew intends to put in place a 1 year contract with all successful Artists to provide an artistic installation for the 2023 summer festival at Wakehurst.

Through this process we will award multiple contracts. The number of awards will be determined by the indicative costs provided by the tenders received. We envisage appointing between 4 and 8 Artists.

The budget for this tender and all contract awards is approximately £130k. The budget for an individual installation will range between £5k and £30k.

Following contract award there will be a period of research and development. If agreement of a design cannot be reached Kew reserve the right to not proceed to full design and installation stage. The research and development costs incurred up to this point will be paid.

4. PROCUREMENT PROCESS

Stage 1 – Expression of Interest

The purpose of this stage is to test the experience of all Artists that apply and create a shortlist of suitably qualified Artists to invite to Stage 2 – Invitation to Tender.

There are 2 parts to this stage:

Part A - An initial assessment to establish suitability which will be evaluated as pass/fail using the following criteria:

- Appropriate discipline
- Appropriate scale of previous work
- Understanding of working in an outside environment

Part B – Those that pass part A will be invited to attend an online meeting with the Wakehurst Team, where you will be further evaluated as follows

A shortlist of 10 to 15 Artists will be invited to Stage 2.

Stage 2 - Invitation to Tender

Shortlisted Artists will be invited to submit a formal written response more tailored to the requirements of the Summer 2023 festival. The evaluation criteria for this stage will be as follows:

Compliance checks

Kew will check that the contents of the tender comply with the requirements set out in the Invitation to Tender (ITT). Any tender that fails to comply with those requirements may be considered non-compliant and will not be taken through the evaluation process.

Selection Questionnaire

Mandatory standard government questionnaire covering legality of Artists. Any tender that fails to pass any of those criteria will not be taken further.

7. SUBMISSION

Formal EOIs must be submitted via the tendering portal no later than the date and time detailed in this document. Your EOI must comprise of the following:

- Completed Artist EOI Questionnaire
- · Supporting evidence/examples where requested by Kew

8. MODIFICATION AND WITHDRAWAL

Artists may modify their EOI prior to the deadline. No EOI may be modified after the deadline for receipt.

Artists may withdraw their EOI at any time. The notice to withdraw must be in writing and sent via the tendering portal message facility.

9. LATE SUBMISSIONS

Any EOI received after the prescribed deadline may be rejected unless the Artist can provide irrefutable evidence that the EOI was incapable of being received by the due date and time.
