Any new personal data gathered incidentally whilst undertaking the contract also needs to be sent to the Controller before being deleted at the end of the contract.
Locations at which the Contractor and/or its subcontractors process Personal Data under this Agreement	The Contractor stores its data on business IT equipment, within a project e-filing structure, which is protected by MFA-enabled devices using cloud storage & backup via DropBox. However, no cloud storage will be used for any Personal Data shared under this Agreement – that data will be stored in separate desktop folders that will be configured so they are not backed-up to the cloud.

It is all password protected. The home office has a regular staff presence, and is rarely left unattended during office hours. The home office is kept secure. Should there be a breach of data security (such as theft of laptop etc.), the Processor (Colin Plant Associates) needs to notify the Controller (Natural England) within 48 hours of realising that the breach has taken place. Natural England will take any further steps required.
