# Specification: NRN Engagement and workshop facilitation Background to Natural England

Natural England is the government's adviser for the natural environment. We provide practical advice, grounded in science, on how best to safeguard England's natural wealth for the benefit of everyone. Our remit is to ensure sustainable stewardship of the land and sea so that people and nature can thrive. It is our responsibility to see that England's rich natural environment can adapt and survive intact for future generations to enjoy.

Background to the specific Natural England work area relevant to this purchase he Nature Recovery Network is core to Natural England's vision of 'thriving nature for people and planet' and our mission of 'building partnerships for nature's recovery'. It is a single, national ecological network of wildlife-rich places. Central to the government's apex goal of improving nature, it benefits people and wildlife by increasing, improving and joining-up these places across England, stretching from our cities to countryside, mountain to sea.

Delivery of the NRN takes us from protection to active restoration of the natural world. It helps us to deal with three of the biggest challenges we face: biodiversity loss, climate change and public health.

We are looking to develop a community of practice centred around the Nature Recovery Network that supports partners, fosters collaboration and allows them to share knowledge. Engagement with the NRN partnership should shape the outputs of this contract and those outputs should be themed around the following deliverables: workshops, facilitated meetings and developing a repository of knowledge/collaboration platform.

#### Requirement

The outputs of this contract are:

- Develop a series of workshops that help partners and partnerships design landscape scale change and prepare projects for investment readiness. This will include at least 4 planning sessions working with the NRN team to advise the design of the workshop process. For example, what do we want the outcomes of the meeting to be, who do we need to involve, how do we incorporate different mechanisms, data and content to make the workshops most effective. Trial and facilitate these workshops in 1-3 locations as advised by the NRN team.
- Facilitate and organise a face-to-face meeting in April or May with the <a href="NRN Partnership">NRN Partnership</a> management group. The aim of this meeting is to develop the group's ways of working to help deliver more nature recovery. This will include at least 2 pre-design sessions with the NRN team as well as supporting and upskilling the NRN team in facilitation. We expect the contractor to book a suitable venue for this session.
- Develop a repository of knowledge/collaboration platform for the NRN partnership to use to facilitate conversations, share knowledge and collaborate on partnership projects.

### **Outputs and Contract Management**

- During early April 2024 Inception meeting between NRN team and supplier via Teams.
- April/early May plan face-to-face session for the NRN management group with the NRN team.
- May facilitate in-person NRN management group meeting.
- May/June work with NRN team to develop series of workshop facilitation plans.
- April / May develop repository of knowledge/collaboration platform and trial with NRN management group either at May in-person meeting or a subsequent online session.
- June/July facilitate trial workshops.
- Contract completion by 2<sup>nd</sup> August 2024.
